

his natural life, subject only to the following provisions. Item Sixth, It is my will that as my five youngest sons (to wit) James B. Barkley, Jason Barkley, Samuel Barkley, George Barkley and Joseph Barkley, shall as they respectively arrive at the age of twenty one years, they shall each receive the sum amounting to three hundred dollars, which my son Isaac Barkley has received (to wit, Twenty eight hundred and seventy dollars) I also wish to each of my said five youngest sons in absolute property the sum of three hundred dollars to be paid as they become of age or as soon thereafter as they may call on my Executors for the same.

Item Eighth. It is my will that so much as I have given to my son Levi Barkley the sum of three hundred and ninety eight dollars more than I have given to either of my other sons, that he shall pay back to my Executors for the benefit of my wife Anne Barkley that amount with interest from the date of this will; but should he fail or refuse to do so in that event my six younger sons shall each of them be entitled at the death of their mother Anne Barkley to the sum of Three hundred and ninety eight dollars with interest from the date of this will out of the estate remaining in her hands at the time of her death and the balance to be equally divided between all my sons, but should he pay back the aforesaid sum of Three hundred and ninety eight dollars in that case the property to be divided at their mother's death.

Item Ninth. It is my will that my five youngest sons (to wit) James B. Barkley, Jason Barkley, Samuel Barkley, George Barkley & Joseph Barkley, be raised clothed, schooled out of my estate without being charged there with, and that each of them receive such allowances as my two older sons Levi & Isaac Barkley has received. Item Tenth. It is my will in order that my Executors may have full power and authority to meet the legacies as desired above that they are fully clothed with full and authority to sell and convey my lands in any part thereof, my slaves in any part of them or any of my property of all descriptions, they are also vested fully with full power provided they my said Executors and legatee can agree in the price of land negroes or other property to pay off the aforesaid legacies in land negroes or property to pay but in the event they cannot agree in the price of property the legacies shall be paid in money except the sum of Three hundred dollars which shall be left to the discretion of the choosing of the parties provided they my Exors. and legatee cannot agree as to its value in each case or in the case of each legatee. (Item Eleventh) It is my will that my five youngest sons as they grow up should until they are of age attend to the business of their mother as my two first sons has to mine & that they should be industrious and learn how to work. (Item Twelfth) I do hereby appoint constitute and ordain my beloved wife Anne Barkley and my son Isaac Barkley my Executors to carry into execution on this my will given under my hand this 27th day of September 1834.
