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In the name of God Amen, I George Brunaugh of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and memory do make constitute and ordain this to be my last will and testament, First I have given to my son William Brunaugh at sundry times as far as kept against him, the sum of Eight hundred and two dollars and fifty cents, which I now give and bequeath to him as a part of his legacy property. Second. I have given to my son in law William Dickman at sundry times in property as far as kept against him the sum of Eight hundred and two dollars and fifty cents, which I now give and bequeath to the said William Dickman as part of his legacy. Third I have given to my son George C Brunaugh at sundry times in property as far as kept against him the sum of three hundred and twenty dollar and twenty five cents which I now give and bequeath to the said George C Brunaugh as a part of his legacy. I also give and bequeath the further sum of Two hundred and thirty one dollar and seventy five cents to the lawful children of my son George C Brunaugh - I wish. It is my will that my daughter Margaret Brunaugh as she shall under some mind and body working should be taken charge of by my son William Brunaugh to be educated and settled in a decent manner, and that in my son William in consideration of which shall be paid annually the sum of fifty dollar by my Executors herein after mentioned but if the Executors herein mentioned should die before said Margaret and a division of my property should take place amongst my children it is my will that each of my children should pay a proportional part of fifty dollars to my son William as long as he keeps and supports my daughter Margaret or if in the said William should fail to keep and support said Margaret it is my will the sum of fifty dollars be paid annually to whoever may have charge of her and supports her decently. In addition to the above bequest to my son William Brunaugh it is my will that if he takes charge of my daughter Margaret and treats her with care and kindness that he be paid out of my estate the further sum of two hundred dollars provided that my estate can conveniently pay the above sum of Two hundred dollars and not be proper for it or in other words after my estate is wound up and all the legacies shall have received their respective bequests - Then 5th I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah Eight hundred & two dollars and fifty cents in property to be retained at the same rate as near as practicable by her or three men in the neighborhood who are good judges of the value of property (there must be chosen by herself) I pay at the same rate as the property given to my son William, George C. and son in law William Dickman, which valuation of property will appear by a reference to a book which I kept the accounts of my son William, George C. and William Dickman in. It is my will that my wife have choice of property to set out of to make the above sum of Eight hundred and two dollars and fifty cents, I further more give & bequeath to my beloved wife Sarah the plantation on which I live during her life if she remains unmarried, if she remains a widow till death, it is my will that the said plantation be sold.

115. Item 6th. It is my will that the balance of my estate be divided so amongst
 the remainder of my children minors as they become of age or marry (to-wit)
 Lucy Ann, John M., James H., Eliza Jane and Addison. The sum of
 Eight Hundred and two dollars and fifty cents, each so as to make them
 equal to the bequests, I have made to the first mentioned children so be paid
 to them in property to be raised at the same rates as these first named
 children. If any remainder or residue should be of my estate after all the
 above bequests are satisfied and all my just debts are paid it is my will
 that it be equally divided amongst all my children. But if there should
 not be property sufficient to meet the above bequests to Lucy Ann, John M.,
 James H., Eliza Jane and Addison as they become of age or marry then so
 that each may have and every of them must wait for their legacy until
 the plantation is sold and the money for the same realized. It is my will
 that the balance left to Lucy Ann, John M., James H., Eliza Jane and Addison
 remain in the hands of my wife Sarah until they marry or arrive at lawful
 age in consideration of their support education &c. I do hereby constitute
 and appoint my dearly beloved wife Sarah executrix of this my last will
 and testament and also my friend. Executed, it my will
 that they act as such without giving security to the court. Given from
 under my hand and seal this 30th day of May in the year of our Lord
 Eighteen Hundred and thirty one.

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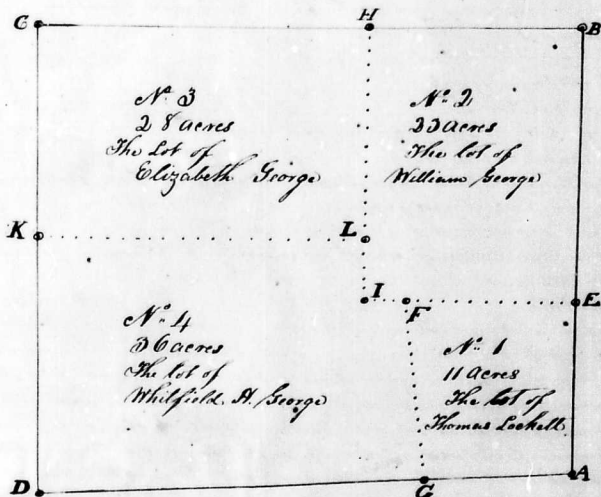
