I, Nathan Brantley of Jepsum County and State of Kentucky being at this time in a bad state of health but of sound mind and memory knowing it is appointed me for all men to die, I do make constitute and ordain this to be my last will & testament. It being the only one I have ever made. I have given to my son Levi Brantley in money and slaves to the amount of thirty one hundred and thirteen dollars. Also four hundred and fifty five dollars in chattel property out of which to his wife I have given to my son Isaac Brantley five hundred and thirty five dollars in land and a negro which he has received. I also give to my son Isaac Brantley five hundred and thirty five dollars in chattel property out of my estate when he is called to it. I have given to my wife Sarah Brantley all the remainder of my estate to-wit: Land, negroes, horses, cattle, sheep and hogs, all my household and kitchen furniture, farming tools of every kind, blacksmiths tools, my crop of every kind all debts due and demands of every kind of which I am possessor or may be coming to her after my death to be paid to her or to her heirs to have hold and enjoy the same during
