In the Name of God Amen I Fortunatus Davenport being of sound mind and memory
 and considering the uncertainty of life and the necessity of death do constitute this my last
 will and testament in the manner and form following to wit I give my soul to the
 God who gave it me and my Body to be buried as my Executors hereinafter named may direct
 Item I give and devise that at my just debts shall be paid Item I give and bequeath
 unto my beloved wife Nancy Davenport my tract of land whereon I now live with the mansion
 house and plantation comprising one hundred acres designated as follows Beginning at a hickory
 corner to John Hawks thence to the Shaker road and north to the Shaker house corner
 and with Shaker line to Daniel and Patterson corner thence a short line to my Orchard having
 one acre of Apple trees to the west thence northwesterly for quantity I also give unto my wife Nancy
 four Negroes two sugar men and two Negro Women by one Negro man named Rubin and one
 Negro man named Isaac and one Negro Woman named Sally and one Negro woman named William
 Sally give unto my wife Nancy all my house hold kitchen furniture during her life or widowhood
 and also all the poultry my doggen and pigs and two horses of her choice and all the plover and
 then have also half of all my stock of cattle pigs and sheep also as much grain meal and feed
 as will serve the family for one year Item I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Davenport
 three Negroes namely William Shattell and his child Lucy which I suppose my son Charles has
 already received of me Sally give unto my son Charles my best gun Item I give unto my
 son John D. Davenport five Negroes one man named Zach and three a woman named Agnes
 I also have children Aaron Isaac and Martha and these in case but of my son John D.
 Davenport has any claims against my Estate the 2^d Negro man Zach is to be sold to pay a claim
 Item the 1st I give to my son George D. Davenport five Negroes by a Negro boy named William also
 a boy named Benjamin also a girl named Mildred and a woman named Betsy and her child named
 she also one cat &c Item the 3^d I give to my son Kelly D. Davenport two Negroes now in his
 possession one a boy named Washington the other a girl named William also five hundred dollars
 to be raised from the sale of one hundred acres of land excepted out of the tract whereon I now live
 on the former part of this my will I land to be sold on one two and three years credit but of my
 said son Kelly D. Davenport has any claims against my estate they are to be paid out the above
 named five hundred dollars Item the 4th I give unto my daughter Sally D. Davenport three
 Negroes by one Negro woman named Mary and her two children Aaron and Hannah and
 these in case also one horse the next after his mother's death one head of one bear cow and one
 small sheep table Item the 5th I give to my daughter Mary Ann Davenport two Negroes
 by one a boy named Dick and a girl named Mary and her increase and one cat &c also one
 horse next after Sally's death also one hundred dollars money Item the 6th I give to my
 daughter Anne D. Davenport two Negro girls one named Betsy and one named Fanny and
 these in case also one hundred dollars in money Item the 7th I give to my daughter Martha
