State of Kentucky Hyamine County 1st

In the name of God Amen Henry Green being within body but of sound and perfect mind - do hereby say that do make this my last will and testament in full of all that I own and possess that my funeral expenses and all debts all be paid, Article 1st I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Green all the remainder of my estate to have and to hold as her own property so long as she remains my widow, and if in case she die Margaret Green should have then in that case my estate hereafter named mine and shall let up and all all my estate to the highest bidder, and pay over to the said Margaret her share out of my estate, Article 2nd I will and bequeath to my beloved children and grand children the balance of my estate, that is to say I will that it must be divided into five equal parts, and divided between my children Green, my daughter Amy Green, my daughter Michael Green late Davis, the four infant children of my son James are to have one equal share out of the five parts divided equally between them into four parts (to wit) James Green, Henry Green, Margaret Green, and Margaret Green, the four infant children of my daughter Susan Green late Sarah Hill are to have one equal share out of the five parts divided equally between them into four parts (to wit) Henry Hill, Susan Hill, John Hill and Margaret Hill, and if the said Margaret Green should live till my widow what ever estate she leaves must be divided equally between my children and grand children into five equal parts as heretofore divided and ordered, and that whatever amount that is to go to my eight grand children heretofore named remain in the hands of my Administrator hereafter named until they severally arrive to the age of twenty one years old and as they become of age pay over to them their respective shares, and lastly I do hereby appoint my friend, Jethro Henry and my son John Green (widow of my last wife and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 25th day of July and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine.
