

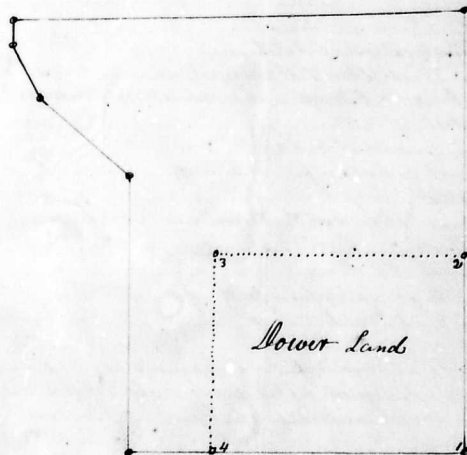

Which is \$141.66 cts over her third which she has to pay to the heirs. — At B. The value of the slaves which are here allotted in the Dever was taken from the appraisement bill and were allotted in the Dever by the former commissioners (except Dinah, an old woman) which are valued at \$100 when we divided the estate among the children. All of which is respectfully submitted to the Jefferson County court.

The foregoing allotment of Dever to Zucanach Hays in the Land & slaves of her late husband Joseph Hughes Decd was this day returned to court examined and ordered to be recorded, which is done — Test Dever to Price etc

On the name of test. I Henry M'ey of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky being in my right mind & believing as I do, that all men must shortly die. Have thought proper to make this my last will and testament for the disposition of my estate both real and personal in the following manner, vizt It is my will that all of my just debts shall be paid. 2^dly. It give to my own brother and sister one equal half of all my estate, an equal proportion to each one of them as named Nancy M'ey at her decease, James Shepherd, Shadrach M'ey, Agnes M'ey and Mary Six, part M'ey, John M'ey, David M'ey — The other

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equal half to be divided between my wives (Mary Ann M'ey) Brothers and sisters, William, Judith, John, George, John, Joseph, John, Benjamin, Peter, John, Francis, Peter, and Simon, Edward, John, John, lastly I do appoint John Trotter and Philip Smith the Executors of this my last will and testament. Also It is my will that the above named I Brother B. P. Smith shall make sale of all and every part of my estate and make a fair dividend between the above named Legates or their lawful representatives. Reserving all this will of every description whatsoever. Witness my hand and seal this twenty ninth day of Sept. Eighteen hundred & thirty. Attest James H. Sallee Henry M'ey

I, Mason Singleton of Jefferson County and State of Kentucky do make this my last will and testament, and publish the said.
First, I with my wife, Fanny & my son, Walter the heirs place, a look down with one hundred & ten acres of land attached thereto. It is my wish that my wife Fanny have the following slaves, O'Faney, Sam, James, Rachael &c. given as her portion of the slaves, with such stock as she may choose for the amount of and further part of every thing within hand &c. which I have been farming. I do not will that my son Jeremiah have the share I have he now has, also such with her increase, the land at twenty-five dollars per acre, and such &c. Child at Six hundred dollars, he having paid the balance of her price. My son O'Fay to have Sam and what I paid for the land he sold to O'Fay & Singleton at Twelve hundred dollars and the balance of property agreeable to a list which I have recorded for each child as having been received heretofore. I now O'Fay to have Lewis with what I paid for his land at one thousand dollars, the other property of his, and also the balance of the Williams place at twenty dollars per acre, and also twenty acres of land adjoining O'Fay's place twenty dollars per acre. O'Fay daughter Lucy to have O'Fay and Eve at six hundred dollars with the property as listed. O'Fay daughter Jane to have mummy at Six hundred & fifty dollars and other property as listed. O'Fay daughter to have O'Fay at six hundred dollars, and one hundred dollars for Ginny which he sold, and property as listed. I will O'Fay to have the stone house where mother lived with so much of the house place beginning in Lewis Singleton's line running near the spring northwesterly 50° as to give him one hundred & ten acres &c. I give to O'Fay, Sam &c. O'Fay, the land to be valued at twenty-five dollars per acre. I will unite Walter Singleton the land devised in this will for himself his mother is also O'Fay, the land to be valued at twenty-five dollars per acre. It is my last will that Elizabeth O'Fay be made equal in every respect with the part of my Child. - son. It is my unchangeable wish of my alone will that if the sale of the surplus property is not sufficient to make all my children equal that those who have received the most shall refund back until all have received an equal proportion of all my estate.

Witness by my request & sealed with my own seal this 27 day of July 1863. I appoint as my executors my beloved friends, Hawkins Craig, O'Fay & Singleton & Joel M. Singleton.
