The undersigned commissioners appointed by the Supreme Court at their ordinary term 1826 to attend the power to Catherine Dickerson widow of Leander Dickerson deceased being first duly sworn according to law have had the same under consideration and after an examination of the accounts of the administrators of said estate we find the chattle property in the hands of the said Administrators belonging to the aforesaid estate to amount to the sum of \$833.34 exclusive of the hire of a negro boy named Sam for two years which we suppose to be equal to \$15 each year making \$135 which when added to the above sum of \$833.34 will make \$968.34. The one third of which say \$322.78 was added to the said Catherine Dickerson for her share in the aforesaid estate. We have also examined the slaves belonging to the aforesaid estate and find there are two negro men to wit, Buck and Price worth \$275 in specie each there being but two we are unable to divide them in kind, we therefore allow to the said Catherine Dickerson the one third of the value here of the aforesaid slaves, all which we hereby leave to depart. Given under our hands this 17th day of November 1826

In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Wade of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being in common hear the voice of sound mind and good memory thanks be given to Almighty God calling to mind the mortality of my body and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament that is to say first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God that give it and my body to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors nothing shall bind but at the general Resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate as I have I give and bequeath to be kept in this world I give bequeath and dispose of in the following manner and form, Ist That all my lawful debts be paid out of my estate I^{2d} I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Comfort Wade all the whole of my estate consisting the half of the survey of land formerly occupied by William Boatman now occupied by myself the whole containing one hundred and twenty one acres and some few bolts divided as follows from William Wade line cross the plantation to Michael Smith's line with that part joining Charles Coulter's Improvement including all the Duties with all the Farming utensils Furniture all my live stock of every description with all my whole possessions by her to be lawfully and peaceably possessed and enjoyed enduring her natural life at her decease then I^{3d} my will is desire is that my son William Wade receive five Dollars to be paid out of my estate I^{4th} that my Daughter Mary Coleman receive five Dollars out of my estate I^{5th} that all the remaining part of my estate both real & personal be equally divided between my two Daughters Polly & Sally Wade by them to be fully and truly possessed and enjoyed forever to have and to hold constitute & Ordain Michael Wade and John Bramfield the sole Executors of this my last Will & Testament and that I do utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Legacies that or have by me heretofore made & done and do acknowledge that no other to be my last will & Testament.
