In the name of Almighty God Amen I Jacob Price of Jessamine County and State of Kentucky being in full health but of sound disposing mind and memory and owing to the certain and awful realities of the death of the mortal body and being desirous of making a disposition of the estate with which I am provided and kind Providence in his goodness has thought proper to me do hereby publish and declare the following to be my last will and Testament to wit In the first place it is my will and desire that out of my estate my executors hereinafter named pay all my just debts secondly it is my will and desire that immediately after my death my two slaves Martha and his wife Leah be emancipated and set free and that James Gooch who I have appointed as one of my executors take the necessary legal steps to have the said slaves lawfully set free he they said Gooch from (where I purchased them) having agreed with me that he will exercise a care over them and be responsible for their not becoming chargeable to the County and that my other slave named Lucy at my death be also emancipated and set free by my executors in a lawful manner and to be mentioned out of my estate under the care of James Gooch Thirdly I give and bequeath unto my brother Henry Price Three hundred dollars to be paid over by my executors and it is further my wish that he shall not be held responsible for a note left in his hands due to my mother's

estate or for any money which he may have collected of the said estate —
Fourthly It is my will and desire that my executors hereinafter named do upon which such credit as they shall think most advisable and profitable make sale either privately or publicly of my landed estate and property in the town of Nicholasville and upon the receipt of the purchase money make a full conveyance for the same — It is also my will that my executors make public sale of the remainder of my estate personally upon a reasonable credit and out of the money arising from the sale of all my estate pay my debts and the legacy to my brother Henry above named and the residue it is my will and desire and I do hereby bequeath to be equally divided between my brother John Reed George Reed and my sister Mary Rice wife of my brother Samuel Reed Betsey Branner wife of Thomas Branner and Magdalena Cloed wife of Henry Cloed further it is my will that my brother George should be paid his portion which I have bequeathed to him provided he will bear an equal proportion with my other brother and sister of whatever they may be made responsible for on account of the sale of a tract of land in the State of Maryland and if he should not then my executors to reserve for that purpose as much out of his portion as will pay an equal share of said demand should any ever be made on account. In the name of God Amen, I David Jackson being of sound and disposing mind and memory but frail of body and aware of the uncertainty of human life, do make & publish this my last will and testament. First I desire that all my just debts shall be paid. Secondly I give and bequeath to the legal heirs of my dear daughter Polly Jackson the portion of my estate which I intended for my daughter Polly which is one equal share with all the rest except the sum of one hundred dollars heretofore given her of my children, except David who for his trouble and expense and attention to my wants &c I intend to give two shares. The sum of one hundred dollars which I gave Polly is a part of the portion of her children, as my intention is to charge each child with whatever they have had, I give to David one equal share also but to be charged with the sum of one hundred and fifty dollars, which I have heretofore given him. I give to Elijah one equal portion & to be charged with the sum of two hundred dollars given him heretofore. I give to my daughter a fully one dollar only she having had her full share. I give to my son Benjamin one equal share, I also to give one full share, not subject to any deduction, having given them heretofore little or nothing. I give one equal share to Nancy Allen & the heirs of her body. Also to Deborah and William an equal share, William to be charged with the sum of one hundred dollars. To my son David I give for reasons before stated two shares of my estate and Polly I give and bequeath one equal share to my daughter Nancy. I further will and desire that my farm where I live be valued by two disinterested men, and David to retain it by paying within four years without interest after my decease, to the other children, whatever sum said land may be valued to over and above his two shares. David is to take care of my daughter Nancy, she being the youngest child, free of charge. I appoint my dear sons David and James and my friend Geo. H. Brown Executors of this my last will & testament, and my further wish is that the court will not require security of them. The negroes, stock, farming utensils, household & kitchen furniture &c to be valued and retained by the children if they choose to do so if not then to be sold at the discretion of my executors.  except one other week and such such as they shall make choice
 of from among my negroes.
