In the name of God, Amen, I Jacob Sadowsky being advanced in age and my health being much impaired but perfectly sound both in mind and memory do make and establish this my last will and testament. — I Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Eliza both during her natural life the following property (to wit) One hundred and fifty acres of land so as to include secure all the improvements, where I now live and to commence at the corner of my son James Sadowsky's lot and to bind on the One hundred acres I intend giving him and his children in this will hereafter to be mentioned, and to be laid off in the most suitable form so as to include the 150 acres, and if any thing should happen, my Daughter Martha and children are to have seventy five acres of the land willing to my wife immediately. I also give to my wife two negro men namely Paris & Isaac for my and her five children, Mary Healy, Malinda, Wiley and Henry all during her natural life. I give also to my beloved wife Elizabeth my carriage and such horses of her choice as she may want, and as much of the household and kitchen furniture as she may think she wants together with three farming utensils and cattle that she may need, to be selected by herself or some friend whom she may choose. — I Item I give to my daughter Rebecca Martha's children, One hundred & fifty acres of land the same that I have willed to my wife during her natural life to my daughter Rebecca and her children after my wife's death, to her and her children that she now has or may hereafter have for their own use and benefit and not to be under the control of her husband, but she my daughter to have the whole control of the land during her life and at her death to be equally divided between all her children to each and equal share. — I Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Sally Kelly's children One hundred acres of land on the south end of my present tract to be laid off by my executor in a suitable form, to her my daughter and her children, and not to be controlled by her husband but she is to have the use or rent of the above hundred acres to manage as she sees best, and at her death, I bequeath the above hundred acres to her children, to each one equal share. — I Item I give to my son James Sadowsky's children, One hundred acres of land to commence adjoining the place where Ora Bartons now lives and to be laid off in a suitable form so as to include one hundred acres for him to occupy during his life and at his death to be equally divided between all his children alive at his death to each an equal share, I also give to my son James my negro man Abraham to be for the benefit of raising his two children, but not to be answerable for the payment of his debts, the land is not to be taken from the children in any case to pay his debts but he is to occupy the land if he chooses to maintain his children.

13. In case he does not occupy the land, the land and negroes to be rented & hired out so to maintain his children by my executors or if he should wish to move to a new country then my executors shall have power to sell and convey the land above named and to make a good and sufficient title by deed, and to lay the money out in a new country for land for his children and make the title of the land so purchased to all his children with liberty for him to occupy the same during his life or so much of the land as he may need for his own use to occupy. — Item. I give and bequeath to my daughter Susan Nege, Twenty three hundred dollars, four hundred of which I have paid for a negro woman I bought for her, the balance of nineteen hundred dollars, I give in the following manner, first it is my wish knowing that there is now several suits pending between the Nege, John Nege & James Nege against Jacob Sedoway jr and James Sedoway, it is my will that out of the nineteen hundred dollars, I was prepared to give my daughter, all the costs, judgments and all the loss or damage that the Nege's may recover of Jacob & James shall come out of my daughter Susan's part and this will shall be a sufficient voucher for my executors for paying the same and charging against my daughter's life, & finally my sons Jacob & James are not to receive one cent by these suits, but whatever amount they have to pay is to be refunded as above either in damages or costs, the balance of the nineteen hundred dollars that I design for my daughter to make her equal with my other children, I give the interest as soon as it shall or even be put to interest, but if any unforeseen accident shall happen that she may be necessitated for money to support upon during her life, then this money may at the discretion of my executors be laid out or paid in such way as they may think best during the life of the said Susan Nege and at her death she is to dispose of the balance that may be in the hands of the executors as she pleases. — Item. I have already given to my daughter Peggy (Deceased) four hundred dollars and it is my wish that her children shall receive what I intended for her, agreeable to my estimate there is yet seven hundred dollars to be given them, which I want to divide equal with them after deducting the money that may be spent in educating the small children by executors, the money to pay these legacies is to be raised by selling all my stock and probable property and the hire of all my negroes not until my wife's death and then the sale of a small piece of land that I have not willed, and if this should not be sufficient to pay of the legacies then it is to be made up from the sale of my negroes after my wife's death to make these two legacies equal to twenty, three hundred dollars each in the way above described. — Item. It is my wish that my son Jacob Sedoway jr shall receive out of my estate the value of a small portion of land so as to make his quantity, I give him one hundred and fifty acres at the real value of the land for what may be deficient, Last it is my will & desire that after all my just debts are paid and all the legacies are discharged and after my wife's death that every species of property that is mine shall be sold and the amount equally divided between my five children's children, that is each child's children to receive one part, and lastly as this my will I make and say and ordain that if any person claiming under this will or as my heir shall not stand to this will but shall go to law about my estate, then it is my will that they shall forfeit all their right and their share or shares shall be divided amongst the rest, and last of all I set my hand and seal this 25<sup>th</sup> June 1830. It is my wish and desire that my wife and my sons Ephraim Sedoway and Jacob Sedoway may be my acting executors. Given under my hand and seal William Nege, James Nege, Jacob Sedoway, Dea. Thos Bateswood, Hugh Allen

In the name of God Amen, Being far advanced in years and knowing from the course of Nature that I must shortly die, I make this my last will and testament. To my daughter Eleanor Leach I bequeath forty acres of land to be taken from the tract on which I now live to wit, Beginning at a Burr Oak a corner commonly called Old's corner thence to the fifth line and with the south line of my tract until it strikes the Sickman road, thence with the road so far as will give the aforesaid quantity of forty acres by running a straight line from the termination on the road to the beginning at the Burr Oak. The balance of the tract on which I reside I bequeath to the lawful issue of my son John's body containing One Hundred and one and a half acres more or less. To my son John's sons Samuel, James A. John, Thomas and William I give my tract of land adjoining the one on which I live and Nathaniel Welch on the East, James DeLozier on the South supposed to contain about One hundred and ten acres more or less. To the lawful issue of my son John's body I give my slave Abram. To my daughter Eleanor Leach I give my slave Phoebe together with her father in crime in children. To the children of my daughter Nancy Watson deceased to wit (David Watson, Melly Smith and Polly Ann Watson I give my slave Joe. My slave Jack having been faithful through many years service and now infirm and of little value, it is my wish after my death that he should be kept upon the home place given to my son John's children and compelled to labour only at such business as is suitable for his condition. To my son John's children I give my Waggon, gear and appurtenances and six head of horses, three sown mares, four horn a bay horse colt one year old and a bay filly one year old. The balance of my horses I give to the children of my deceased daughter Nancy Watson. To my grand daughter Polly Ann Watson I give one cow the choice of my stock to be by her made. To my grand son William Old's I give one cow. All the rest, residue and remainder of my estate both real and personal I bequeath to the children of my son John Welch. It is my wish that my trusty friend Daniel B. Jones should take upon himself the execution of this will agreeable to the several bequests and devise herein made for which end and purpose I direct that he should be permitted to qualify as my executor without giving bond security for the performance of the duties imposed upon him by law as such, in as much as I have entire confidence in his integrity and that he will do whatsoever I have herein requested and directed from pure motives. In testimony of the foregoing three pages being my last will and testament I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal this twelfth day of January 1832.

In the name of God Amen I James A. Campbell of the county of Seppimus and State of Kentucky, considering the uncertainty of this mortal life and being of sound and perfect mind and memory, blessed be almighty God for the same, do hereby make and publish this my last will and testament in manner and form following (that is to say):

First I give and bequeath to my wife Eleanor A. Campbell one half the tract of land wherein I now live containing about two hundred & thirty acres, that is the one half the number of acres in said tract, to be laid off on the East side of said tract to adjoin the farm now owned by Lydia Young widow of Thomas Young died, the division line to run through the passage of the mansion, and to run thence its course each way so far as will best suit each half, and to run to the original boundaries of said tract each way by lines that may best suit each half so as to have an equal quantity and part of the house on each side. Also one negro man named Harry his share of three horses out of my whole stock of horses, one third of all the cattle sheep & hogs and one half of the farming utensils that I may die possessed of during his natural life, on the following conditions (to wit) the land she is to have as long as she chooses to live on it and occupy it as her own, but not to rent or sell her interest in said land to any person or persons whatever except to my son Wallace M. Campbell, as it is my will and desire that said land together with the negro man Harry at the death of my said wife shall pass on & devolve to my said son Wallace M. Campbell. Also I give and bequeath to my wife Eleanor One negro woman named Fanny & one negro boy named Ora, all the household & kitchen furniture of every description that I may die possessed of, to her and her heirs forever. I also bequeath the last dinner of 3 negroes Fanny & Ora and the furniture to dispose of as she may think proper. I do also give and bequeath to my daughter Susan Young the sum of seven hundred and fifty dollars and no more, which I consider his equal share of all my estate both real and personal including what she has received herebefore, the whole to descend to her and to her heirs forever. I do also give and bequeath to my son John A. Campbell the several tracts of land wherein he now lives and has full possession of, to wit the tract and deeds for the same heretofore deeded to me but now in his possession, said tract contains about 120 acres, also one other tract (part of south side military survey on Marble creek) containing fifteen acres appertaining to my son John A. Campbell for the same, also one negro man named Phoebe one negro boy named Mary, to him and his heirs forever. I do also give and bequeath to my son Wallace A. Campbell, one half the tract of land wherein I now live, that is the balance of said tract not within my wife, and to be laid off agreeable to the division line designated in her will, also the other half deeded to my wife, after her death which will include the whole tract (at her death) supposed to be 200 acres, also one other tract of land (part of south side military survey on Marble creek) containing twenty acres, which was purchased in partnership with James and others of the executors of Matthias Moore died and the whole has been deeded to said Gregg by said executors, also one negro man named Rachel, one negro boy named Dick, one negro woman named Fanny, and one negro man named Harry who is willing to serve during his natural life and heretofore named as a devise & heretofore named as a devise. Also all the balance of my estate of every kind and nature (not heretofore devised) that I may die possessed of, I bequeath to my daughter Susan Young her legacy of seven hundred and fifty dollars.

The undersigned commissioners appointed by the Sepamino County Court  
to settle with the Executors of Joseph Christman decd. having attended to  
the duties assigned them beg leave to report. We find that the Executors  
chargeable with \$2680 32 1/2 balance in their hands on a former  
settlement as per record. They have received since said settlement from  
Virginia for rent of lands \$1909 81 1/4 making together the sum of  
\$4640 14. It appears that the Executors have disbursed \$1563 63 1/2  
in vouchers and 1839. Add to this sum  
\$217 78 the amt we have allowed them for their services being 5 per  
cent upon the amt disbursed make the sum of \$4872 41 1/2 which  
being deducted from \$4640 14 the amt of debts leaves a balance in  
the hands of the Executors of \$232 27 1/2 according to the foregoing ac-
