I Jacob Zike son, being weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory and belling to mind the mortality of the body and knowing that it is once appointed for all flesh to die and being desirous to dispose of my worldly goods do ordain and establish this my last will and testament in form as follows to wit first I give my soul to God whomever it to me nothing doubting but that I shall receive it again at the resurrection of the body, and my body to be buried in a decent christian like manner and as to my worldly goods I dispose of them as follows it is my will and desire and bequeath to my beloved wife Katherine Zike all my estate properly and the same on which I now live during her natural life under the care and management of my son Willard Zike who I wish to have the proceeds of the same over and above decently and justly supporting my said wife and at her death it is my will and desire that the aforesaid land and chattel property all shall be sold by my executors and divided among my children agreeable to what may be coming to each one of them on a settlement for I give some more than others as will be seen by the account I shall again each of them which account must be left with the wife paid ^{them} it is also my will that what portion of my estate should be going to my daughter Susanna both should be equally divided among my said daughters children that she had by James Scott. it is also my will that my two friends Mathew W Walker and Geo T Christman should be my executors to this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 3 day of December ~~1822~~ in the year of our lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight in the presence of us.

Agreeable to an order of the Jedamine County court at their September Term 1829 ordered that Richard Noke Ephraim Carter, Samuel Deum and John Procter were appointed commissioners to settle with Maria Singleton as Adm of Thom Garnett Deed.
