In the name of God Amen I Joseph Crockett of Jefferson County Kentucky do make and publish this to be my last will and testament After and bequeath to my daughter Polly Bower and Eliza Price and the heirs of this bodie Wholsum estate. I may be in possession of at my death, or monies which may be due me from my son Robert Crockett for debt paid by me for him as his security or otherwise toward about Twelve hundred dollars paid by the sale of my farm and other property near the River Mississippi on Richman Creek in part Satisfaction of a Judgement obtained by Lewis Long against me as a co security with him for my said son Robert in a note given to Joseph Tallent about Thirteen hundred dollars paid Joshua Day as due for my son Robert Besides several other small amounts of money paid on Executions as the security of my son Robert Also for a debt which was due to me from William D Todd for upwards of one Thousand dollars Which was appropriated by my son Robert to his use, and now repaid him — I also give and bequeath to my said daughter & their heirs Wholsum interest I may have in the tract of land laid off at the Loan Banks for the benefit of the officers in the American State line in the Revolutionary war, my rank and pay in said service being that of a Colonel — and I further give and bequeath to them all other right & interest in which I may be entitled either by law or equity. Lastly I appoint my sons in Law Samuel M. Bower & Daniel B. Ford the Executors of this my last will & testament Nowly revoking all other wills or wills by me made. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Eighth day of December 1782
