Also the heirs of my beloved son Andrew Straney after deducting out thirteen dollars and fifty cents out of his part then he is to be made up equally with the rest of my children. Also I wish Joel Springfield and Mr. Wade to be my executors. Where unto I have set my hand and seal this 1st day of September in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and thirty three.

 Pursuant to your order, made September Court, 1883. We the under signed
 Commissioners report as follows: Having before us a copy of a former
 division made by your order, we proceeded first to ascertain the undi-
 vided part which is marked on the plat by the letters J. B. & D.
 and containing 78 Acre 3 Rods, we then purchased each lot of the former
 division and first show as follows: W. B. Hughes lot, marked by
 the letters B. B. & D. and containing 35 Acres, Joseph D. Hughes lot
 marked by the letters J. B. & D. and containing 38 Acres, Sarah
 & Hughes lot marked by the letters B. B. & K. and containing 35
 Acres, John B. Hughes lot marked by the letters C. H. & E. M. O.
 and containing 38 Acres, Joel W. Singletary in his lot, one of 19 1/2 Acres
 and marked by the letters S. O. J. & K. the other 12 1/2 Acres and letters
 S. O. J. M. — We then added Sarah & Hughes lot to the undivided part
 (the having decd.) which made 113 Acre 3 rods, and then divided
 as follows: Joel W. Singletary we allotted 26 Acre 2 rods 20 poles
 which we added to his former 15 1/2 Acre lot making 41 1/2 Acre 1
 rod 20 poles, and in the following form, Beginning at a hick-
 ory in Delaplains line (see S) thence S 70° E 112.6 poles to a stone
 (1) thence N 19° E 59 poles to a stone (2) thence N 70° E 20.9 poles
 to a stone (3) thence N 19° E 3 poles to a stone (4) thence N 5° E 11.6

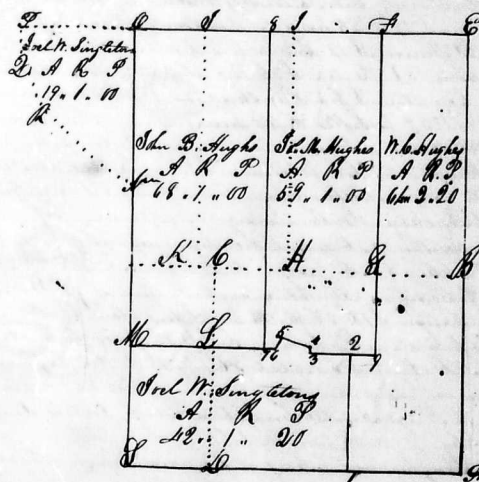
