In the name of God Amen. I Jacob Zike son of living man in body but of sound mind and disposing memory and belling to mind the mortality of the body and knowing that it is once appointed for all flesh to die and being desirous to dispose of my worldly goods do ordain and establish this my last will and testament in form as follows to wit first I give my soul to God who gave it to me nothing doubting but that I shall receive it again at the resurrection of the body and my body to be buried in a decent christian like manner and as to my worldly goods I dispose of them as follows it is my will and desire and give to my beloved wife Katherine Zike all my estate properly and the same on which I now live during her natural life under the care and management of my son Willard Zike who I wish to have the proceeds of the same over and above decently and justly supporting my said wife and at her death it is my will and desire that the aforesaid land and estate property all shall be sold by my executors and divided among my children agreeable to what may be coming to each one of them on a settlement for I give some more than others as will be seen by the act of God I have against each of them which account must be kept with the will of God as it is my will and desire that my wife Katherine Zike during her natural life should have the use of the same and at her death it is my will that what portion of my estate should be going to my daughter Sumner both should be equally divided among my said daughters children that she had by James Scott it is also my will that my two friends Mathew W Walker and Geo T Christman should be my executors to this my last will and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 3 day of December 1822 in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty eight in the presence of us.

In the name of God Amen Henry Green being within body but of sound and perfect mind - do hereby say that do make this my last will and testament in full of all that I own and possess that my funeral expenses and all debts all be paid, Article 1st I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Margaret Green all the remainder of my estate to have and to hold as her own property so long as she remains my widow, and if in case the said Margaret Green should die then in that case my children hereafter named mine and shall sit up and all all my estate to the highest bidder, and pay over to the said Margaret her share out of my estate, Article 2nd I will and bequeath to my beloved children and grand children the balance of my estate, that is to say I will that it must be divided into five equal parts, and divided between my children Green, my daughter Amy Green, my daughter Michael Green late Davis, the four infant children of my son James are to have one equal share out of the five parts divided equally between them into four parts (to wit) James Green Henry Green and Margaret Green, the four infant children of my daughter Susan Green late Sarah Hill are to have one equal share out of the five parts divided equally between them into four parts (to wit) Henry Hill, Susan Hill, John Hill and Margaret Hill, and if the said Margaret Green should live till my widow what ever estate she leaves must be divided equally between my children and grand children into five equal parts as heretofore divided and ordered, and that whatever amount that is to go to my eight grand children heretofore named remain in the hands of my Administrator hereafter named until they severally arrive to the age of twenty one years old and as they become of age pay over to them their respective shares, and lastly I do hereby appoint my friend, Jethro Henry and my son John Green (widow of my last wife and testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 25th day of July and in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and twenty nine
