Worthington the Administrator of the estate of Janet Picklin deceased who was Guardian of the Person of Polly Picklin, & Price Picklin, & Price Picklin make report as we found and proceed to examine the acts in relation to the rents of the farm of John Picklin deceased which was devised by him in his last will to be appropriated to the support of younger children of the said. The acts as produced to us show that there has been received by guardian rents to the amount of \$391 35 cents for the years 1826, 1827, 1828, 1829, 1824 & 1825 that from the vouchers also produced by said Worthington & his wife, plus sumbura on a sheet marked No. 80.
