The undersigned Commissioners appointed by the honorable Jefamaria County Court at their September Court for 1833 for the purpose of settling Sarah Blackbore widow of John Blackford dec'd her dower in said Blackford's estate, have discharged the duty assigned them to the best of their judgment and have made this report, viz: (The tract of land owned by said decedent contained 1283 Acres, of which we have had a land plat by the County Surveyor as her thirds (only ones). Beginning at a stone in the middle of the Hickman road S.E. Corner of said tract in the old line with Douglas's line, thence with said line N. 87° W. 82° P. to a stone at the top of said line with the center of said line N. 21° E. 107° P. to an ash tree N. 61° E. 68° P. to a stone in the middle of said road in Christian's line, thence with said line to the beginning. - We find the total amt. of dower in said estate supposed to be \$3298.66. after deducting the total amt. of dower against the estate which is \$2112.50 cl. it leaves a balance due the estate of \$1185.56. of which last amount the widow's third will be \$395.19. She having purchased at the sale \$431.75 (which we included in the estate \$39.56. (There is also held and accounted thought to be worth nothing) to the amt. of \$114 not taken into the total estimate of which amt. the widow will be entitled to one third of whatever may be collected. (The foregoing & said Estate consist of one negro man supposed to be worth \$550. One old woman & child supposed to be worth \$250 amounting in the whole to \$800. The widow's third of said negro will be \$267. From the situation of said negroes we have found some difficulty in dividing them
