On the record of for ann. I Elias Hill of the County of Ypsam and State of Kentucky being old and infirm in body but of sound and disposing memory, and calling to mind the certainty of death, do make order publick and declare this instrument as my last will and Testament - First It is my desire that my daughter Sina Saunders wife of William Saunders and her heirs have and hold the tract of Land whereon I now live containing between fifty and sixty acres, be the same more or less. It being the land I purchased from Hinton and Knapp and for which Land I have two separate and of conveyance to have and to hold the tract of Land with all and singular the appurtenances thereto belonging to my said daughter Sina Saunders and her heirs forever. And it is further my desire that should it so happen that I should depart this life at a time when there may be a crop growing or standing on the above said land above begun and then and in that event it is my desire that William Saunders and his heirs shall have the crop that may be then growing or standing upon the farm. I do further give and bequeath to my said daughter Sina Saunders two feather beds & furniture and one horse - one black cow and her increase, the lower is by wheel, little wheel and a reel, one flax hackle, and the flock of geese. I also will bequeath to my son-in-law William Saunders my twining lathe and all my sheepfold - It is further my will and desire that all my just debts be paid, and as a part for that purpose, my Executor hereafter named, shall sell and dispose of all my personal property not herein specifically disposed of at such a time as may be thought best, and collect all the debts that may be due to me at the time of my death, and after paying my debts as aforesaid the balance being the proceeds of my property, shall be equally divided between all my children, namely between William Hinton and his heirs,
