That is to say, Robert Cary a boy, twenty years less with me, three hundred dollars, independent of what I may owe him. I, I do give and bequeath to Mary Sanders and husband a dollar. I, I do give and bequeath to John Allen half my Negroes, two hundred dollars, then after all my debts are paid, as payable to this will, and ten per cent interest where ever I have promised it to my creditors, then and not till then I do hereby direct all the balance of my estate to be fairly and equally divided between my four brothers and sisters, Sally Morrison & Ann Allen and Polly Brinkers children, however in the division of my estate I will and direct that Thomas only shall have seventy five dollars, and do hereby direct my Executors to pay over to the persons herein named, the legacies herein bequeathed to be herein directed. I further more will and direct that all my property real personal or mixed in what ever it may consist of or where ever it may be found, to be sold on a credit of nine months to hold a lease on all my landable estate until the purchase money is paid, then any title my Executors may make shall be as good as if I had made the same in person, which I do here direct them to do.
