I John J. Scott of Jefferson County State of Kentucky now in the evening of my days but of sound mind and disposing memory Calling to mind the uncertainty of life and the certainty of death do hereby make constitute and ordain this my last will and testament hereby revoking and annulling all former wills and testaments whatever. I do after a Christian burial at it is my will and desire that all my just debts be paid as speedily as possible. I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Emily the tract of land upon which I now reside containing about 36 1/2 acres together with all my negro farming utensils household and Kitchen furniture all my stock of every kind and description &c upon the farm for and during her natural life unless she should think proper to marry then and upon that event all her benefits under this will to cease and upon her death or marriage I will that said property revert to my four sons Samuel, Jordan, Harvey, Newton in fee simply to them and their heirs forever. However it is to be distinctly that if my wife should think proper to do so she may distribute any part of said property to her present children; having it in my mind that she should do so.

48 Obligation from the child to whom she distributes it, to account at her death, or marriage to her remaining children, for its value ascertained as above.

Item 3^d I will and bequeath all the remainder of my estate, personal, or mixed, whatever & wherever, to my four sons Samuel, Furdon, Henry, and Abner, to them and their heirs forever, but should either of them die without issue of their bodies, then their proportion to revert to those of them survive.

Item 4th I will and bequeath to my sons, John, Samuel, Furdon, Henry, & Abner, the two tracts of land, I bought of Andrew and Jacob Sedgwick, in trust for the benefit of the children of my daughter Sally, Fletcher, and their is justly due me about eighteen hundred dollars upon said land, thereby imposing in trust as if they then proper, to sell the above named tracts of land, of the proceeds to pay to the my executor the sum of eighteen hundred dollars, and hold the remainder of the money, in trust for the sole use, and benefit of said children of my daughter Sally.

Item 5th I will and bequeath to my sons, John, Margaret, Thomas, and Pannery Scott, children of my son Robert, the sum of fifty dollars each, to be paid to them each, upon their arrival at full age, but ~~they~~ ^{they} should rather die before that period his or her portion to revert to my estate.

Item 6th I will and bequeath unto my grand son John William Shreve, the sum of one dollar and no more having provided for him through his father.

Item 7th I will and bequeath to my son in law Thomas Shreve the sum of one dollar and no more having provided for him.

Item 8th I will and bequeath to my son in law Jas. Fletcher one dollar and no more.

Item 9th I will and bequeath to my daughter in law Mary Scott one dollar and no more.

Item 10th I will and bequeath to my sons William & Thomas Scott two dollars each and no more having fully provided for them.

Item 11th I will to my son John Scott one dollar and no more.

Item 12th I hereby nominate and appoint my wife Milly Executrix and sons Fur Scott, Samuel Scott, Harvey Scott, Furdon Scott, and Abner Scott, Executors of this my last will and testament, hereby willing and requesting that they or such of them as qualify may do so by taking the oaths and without giving Bond and security as required by law signed and published this 2^d day of March in the year of our Lord 1824.

Believing that my time on this earth is but short and wishing to dispose of that little property that may be left after the payment of my just debts (a schedule of which is annexed hereto as much as is necessary) I do hereby publish and make this instrument written solely by my self my will. In the first place should I die before I can effect a sale I desire that my property adjoining the Seminary be sold immediately after my death and the money given and invested in the person that shall act in the business (to be appointed by the County Court of Jefferson) with the consent of the Court. The same of the proceeds arising from said sale to be applied to the discharge of the debt I am owing to the Bank of the Commonwealth at Harrodsburg and should it not be sufficient I desire that my personal property be sold & my books if necessary to pay the whole. The estate of Robert Johnson is owing me two hundred dollars and forty eight cents and if Wm McConnell shall not pay me twenty eight dollars in the amount they will owe me will be two hundred and twenty eight dollars for which I hold Jno D Johnsons note. I have a number of small debts owing me for schooling &c which I wish to be collected as quickly as possible to pay my other debts. I give during my life or widowhood of my wife Judith in conjunction & jointly (so long as they may continue to gather) with my daughter Nancy a share of my shares until she shall attain fifteen years of age the first house & two lots N 109 & 110 which I now occupy that is it
