Pursuant to the same order we proceeded to direct men to be taken eight legates as followeth we first their being eight children we made eight tickets putting the name of a legate on each ticket first then in to a hab appointed Capt D. Arnold to draw them out allowing the first drawn legate to draw the first prize and so on which terminated as followeth. First, 1824 being in debt to draw first drew Randolph appraised to \$225 cash legate being entitled to \$212.25 cents in the value of S^{ts} slaves the pay \$12.75 cents Harvey Trimble drew legate at 275 and paid 62.75 cents Franklin Trimble drew legate at \$200 and received \$2.25 cents James Trimble drew legate a woman at \$250 and paid \$137.75 cents John Trimble drew legate a girl at \$194 and paid \$75.75 cents Andrew Trimble drew legate either and legate two girls at \$195 and received \$27.75 cents James Trimble drew legate a boy at \$195 and received \$44.25 cents Stephen Trimble drew legate a girl ch^d at \$150 and received \$62.25 cents given under our hand & seal this 25 of September 1828
