It is my will that all my just debts and funeral expenses be paid out of my estate I then give & bequeath unto my wife Nancy Washington the whole of my estate, real & personal during her natural life, provided she remains unmarried - but if she marries after my death in that case I will & devise to her that part of my land lying northeast of the branch running from the land of Capt.
