lives in and she is to be decently supported in every thing that she stands in
need of that's necessary and reasonable also I will to her three beds with
these furniture my desk and book case and as many books as she may
think proper to keep one Bureau and cupboard one table nine or ten
ceans one horse one cow and calves five or six sheep and one half
of the kitchen furniture, and that John Meigs that now lives on the
plantation with his wife heirs & Executors is to furnish her with this money
support and to feed her stock as his own and give her twenty five dollars p
year while she lives on the place and all that I have will to her she may
depend on she may think proper but if she thinks proper at any time to leave the
plantation he is to give her fifty dollars p year during life, and at her decease
to be well and bequeath to John Meigs his wife Polly Meigs and their present heirs
this plantation that I now live on at the mouth of sinking Creek deeded to
me by two deeds the one from James Bell of eighty five acres the other of Jacob
Steenhuyzen of sixty one acre but let it be understood that fifty six I will fifteen
acres and the other that is named above and five acres let the same be more or
less that is over the partition fence that has been between me and my brother
Nathaniel Evans for a long time I do will to James Evans and his heirs forever
the balance of my Books that my wife do not choos and the other half of the
kitchen furniture with my clock I do will to Polly Meigs and her heirs also I will to
John Meigs my large bay mare and all my farming utensils also I will
to my sister Mary which two dollars also I will to my sister Rebecca which
two dollars also I will to my sister Hannah which two dollars also I will to my
brother Nathaniel Evans two dollars also I will that John Meigs find James
Evans and William Phelps to be the executor of this my last will & Testament
and I do hereby empower James Evans and William Phelps or either one of them
to make and convey a deed unto John Meigs and his heirs above mentioned if need be
as he would or could do, I am under my hand and seal this nineteenth day of March one
thousand eight hundred and twenty six
