In the name of God, Amen. I James Knight of Jefferson county and State of Kentucky being sick and weak in body but of sound mind and disposing memory (for which I thank God) calling to mind the uncertainty of human life, and wishing to dispose of all such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God to bless me with. I give and bequeath the same in the manner following. That is to say 1st I will and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth Knight the farm on which I now live with all its appurtenances, the farming utensils the Wagon and gear and all belonging to them, the house hold and kitchen furniture to be hers during her natural life. Also it is my will that she shall select any part of the slaves she may think proper for her own use as also as much of the Stock of every description as may appear to her necessary for her use, which plantation with all its appurtenances farming utensils with the house, gear &c with the house hold and kitchen furniture with the slaves and stock she may select, to hold and have the same during her natural life and after her decease, I give the same to my children equally to be divided among them and to be enjoyed by them for ever. And having given a portion of property to all my children except my two youngest sons, James W. Knight and Isaac Knight, I therefore to make them equal in property with my other children it is my will that each of them shall have one Bed and furniture, two cows and calves for Cows with lambs, one ewe, and one pig one Skillet and one or two whippers they require it. 2^d it is my will that the balance of my slaves and stock, which my wife may not select shall be appraised and sold to the highest bidder to be done immediately after my decease and the money arising from such sale to be equally divided amongst all my children. 3^d It is my will that my son in law Elijah shall have and hold a small tract of land belonging to me adjoining my said son in law which I have used for a sugar camp, only to belong to him his heirs, executors, administrators or assigns forever, and he the said Elijah shall be to allow ten dollars per acre for the same to be deducted out of the portion he may be entitled to out of my estate. 4th It is my will also that after the decease of my wife that when the house hold furniture such as Beds and their furniture is appraised, they shall not be sold but the children shall take them at their appraisement equally dividing the same amongst them. 5th and lastly I do hereby constitute and appoint my friends Archibald Legum, John Shannon and Benjamin Boyant Executors of this my last will and Testament hereby revoking all other wills or Testaments by me heretofore made. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal this 21st day of February in year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & twenty eight. Signed sealed published &c declared by James Knight (Dead) as and for the last will & Testament of the above named James Knight in the presence of us. Attest Brecht Neal, William Jefferson, Jefferson County 21st November 1828.

The undersigned being appointed by the Supreme County Court to settle with the Administrators of Joseph Bowman dec'd and to divide the estate both real and personal amongst them, having performed the duties assigned them, they leave to report. They find that the amount of assets which has come into the hands of the Adm'r is \$1179.17 1/2, and that he has disbursed for vouchers \$11 to \$121 inclusive the sum of \$284.16. To which they add \$77.87 1/2 allowed by them to the Adm'r for his services, and \$236.50 for his notes on Dr. Bowman which were appraised and charged to the Adm'r but it appears that the intestate in his life time had charged his son Joseph with the amount of said notes as so much advanced, they have therefore credited the Adm'r by them, the amount of credits will be \$602.84 1/2 which being deducted from \$1179.17 1/2 the amt of debts will leave a balance in the hands of the Adm'r of \$576.62 1/2. One third of this sum the widow is entitled to as her dower, which will leave the balance to be distributed among the heirs \$384.41 2/3. It appears that the heirs have received the following money advancements, viz: Joseph Bowman \$321, Joseph Switzer \$139.87 1/2, Abraham Rice \$119.44, Specht & Anspitzer \$100, Frederick Dittman \$189, John Bowman \$110, David Bowman \$100, Betty Gray \$10.66, Susan Gray \$6.44 and Christian Bowman his portion of the estate in full.
