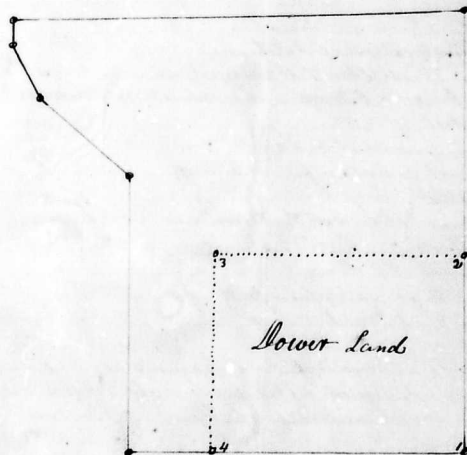

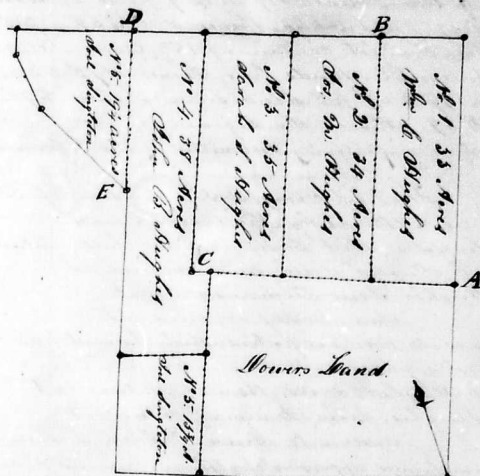

to the administrator \$6.61 1/2 etc, see settlement Page 1st.

We also proceeded to settle with Susanah Hughes, the
guardian of the children of Joseph Hughes deceased and find
her charged with \$296.75 etc for sundry articles & stock taken
out of the estate, of which she is entitled to one third,
which leaves a balance of \$197.84 etc, We likewise
find that in her dower allotted in slaves she drew
\$141.66 etc over her portion, which leaves her indebted
to the heirs \$339.50 etc which must be paid out to
