Jefferson and State of Kentucky being in common health and of
sound mind and memory, thanks be given to Almighty God calling
to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all
men once to die do make and order this my last will and Testament that is
to my first of all I recommend my Soul into the hands of Almighty God that
God and my Body to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of
my Executors nothing here binds but at the general Resurrection I shall receive
the same again. Of the mighty power of God and as touching such worldly estate
and household goods I do bequeath to my wife I give bequeath and dispose
of in the following manner and form, 1st That all my lawful debts be
paid out of my estate. 2nd I give and bequeath to my beloved Wife Comfort
Wade all the share of my estate consisting the half of the survey of land for-
merly occupied by William Boatman now occupied by myself the whole
containing one hundred and twenty one acres and some few poles divided as
follows from William Wade line crop to plantation to Michael Smiths line
with that part joining Charles Cutlers Improvement including all the Build-
ings with all my Farming utensils, Horses and a Station Furniture all my
live Stock of Every description with all my other possessions by her to be law-
fully and properly possessed and enjoyed during her natural life at her
discretion then 3rd my will testator is that my son William Wade to receive Five
Hundred Dollars to be paid out of my estate 4th That my Daughter Nancy Coleman
to receive Fifty Dollars out of my estate 5th that all the remaining part of
my Estate both real & personal be equally divided betwixt my two Daughters
Betty & Emily Wade by them to be fully and truly possessed and enjoyed
for ever & always. It is hereby constituted & Ordained by me that I do
bequeath the sole Executors of this my last will & Testament and that I
do utterly disallow revoke and disannul all and every other former Legacy
Testament or bequest by me heretofore made & done and do acknowledge that I am
about to be my last will & Testament. Whereunto I have set my hand and seal this
eleventh day of July one thousand eight hundred and twenty four

We the undersigned Commissioners appointed by the Jefamine County Court of Jefamine to settle with the Executors & Adm of Edmund Singleton and proceeded to perform the duties

assigned us upon as follows we find from the last settlement with the Exors & Adm to the June Court 1827 that there was a balance against them of fourteen hundred & ninety eight dollars seven & one half cents which was due and payable on the first day of July 1827. We find that there was due from the Exor on the first day of Jan'y 1828 for the hire of slaves \$475.40 3/4 and \$474.35 for the rent of land in clearing the lower land which added together will amount to \$949.75 to which add the balance due on the first day of Jan'y 1827 (over \$1428.17) will be \$2820.80 3/4 we find that the Exor have disbursed during the year 1827 \$448.80 3/4 to which add \$48.44 1/2 Com at 5th cent for disbursements also \$50 for extraordinary trouble &c also \$158.18 1/2 as we find of \$474.35 for lower land will be \$1225.35 to which taking from \$2820.80 3/4 is the balance of 1827 & except of 1827 will leave a balance against the Exors of \$1695.45 1/2 we find that the Exors are chargeable with \$1150.55 3/4 for the year 1828 due & payable Jan'y 1829 for hire of slaves & a judgment against Torble Adams. We find hire slaves \$1106.75 judgment against Torble Adams \$22.80 1/2 and that they disbursed \$266.31 1/2 to which add \$15 to for a com at 5th cent for disbursements also \$12.50 for extraordinary trouble in hiring &c also \$1225.35 for lower land account this day given also \$10 pay for com will be \$2638.84 1/2 the amounts of credits for this year (over) 1828 which added the credits of the year 1827 (over) \$1225.86 1/2 at \$2388.84 1/2 will amount to \$4964.21 1/2 the whole amount of credits taken from the whole amount of debts (over) \$4911.55 3/4 will leave a balance against the Exors of \$452.66 1/2 which is left in their hands for claims that may come against them which they well be bound to pay we have not taken any account for the rents of land this year 1828 in as much as the land was rented by the Adams & Torble Bezekiah J. Elgin and James Singleton not by J. H. Elgin the Exor nor Executor excepting the lower land which was rented by him all of which is a perfectly independent with the other account.
