

B6C. Since closing the within settlement with the Estate of Thos. Roberts died it was ascertained that the sum of \$74.38 had been rec'd by two of the Executors as interest, say by S. M. Allen \$37.48 & John Roberts \$36.90, which had been overpaid by them, we have therefore added the same by way of Appendix, crediting the Estate by the sum of amount left in hands of Court to pay debts and charging the sum of \$17.07 for that effect which is deemed sufficient leaving in hands of Executors subject to distribution the sum of \$593.50 all of which is respectfully submitted.

It is further my wish that the residue of my property be sold and my debts paid and the remainder to be equally divided between my three above named children, Sarah, James and George Chambers. It is further my wish that Samuel M. Fowler & K. Abel & Price be my Executors, and that they shall when they collect the money for my property that I wish sold pay over to my daughter Sarah Chambers her portion of it. It is further my wish that James and George Chambers shall draw their proportion when they become twenty years old this day my will. Given under my hand and seal this 5th day of November 1832.
