

In Conformity to an order of the County Court of Maryland made at their August Term 1826. Appointing the undersigned Commissioners to divide the estate of Richard Ligon dec'd. betwixt the heirs of said dec'd. do make report to having met together for that purpose and being first duly sworn before Mr. Craig Esq. First an examination was find no arrangement made by which we are enabled to divide the land of the decedent consequently proceeded to divide the slaves and apportion in the hands of the adm^r in the following manner (There being Twelve Slaves exclusive of the widows dower of the following names and description we proceeded to value them. Harriett a girl 14 years old \$350. - a woman 21 years old \$387.50. Maria a girl 12 do \$325. Joseph a boy child 1 year old \$100.00 Kelly a girl 7 years old \$250. Mary a girl 6 years old \$250.00. Aggy a girl 4 years old \$150. Jacob a man 23 years old \$500.00. Amster a boy 9 years old \$325. Thomas a boy 18 do \$475.00. Fanny a woman 21 years do \$425.00. David a man 20 do \$450.00. \$3987.50

The aggregate amount of the value of the slaves being \$3987.50 cents and there being one more slave than legatee we made all of the two slaves of the least value to wit Aggy & Joseph and placing the other ten each in a lot separate to themselves making thereby as many lots as legatees. The legacies all being per cent we made eleven tickets placing the names of a slave on each ticket and put them in a hat each legatee drew for themselves the want of which was as follows: M^{rs} Martha Palmer drew at \$500 William Ligon Harriett at \$350 Edward Ligon David at \$450 John Ligon Aggy and Joseph at \$250 Elizabeth Ligon Kelly at \$250 Nancy Ligon Amster \$325. Richard Ligon Fanny at \$425. James Ligon Fanny \$425. Harriett Ligon Maria \$325. Jacob Ligon Mary at \$250. Nathaniel Ligon Thomas at \$475. in the report proceeds in the following manner to wit to each legatee his share as above stated with his proportion of the apportion in the hands of the Adm^r so as to make them equal.  N. B. In order to correct a mistake of \$ 25 in the value of the property allotted to Nancy Lafon Armed a boy at \$ 350. instead of \$ 325 which was his value as fixed by us we say the Adm^r must pay to Nancy Lafon \$ 25 like dollar which will correct the mistake out of the spot in their hands

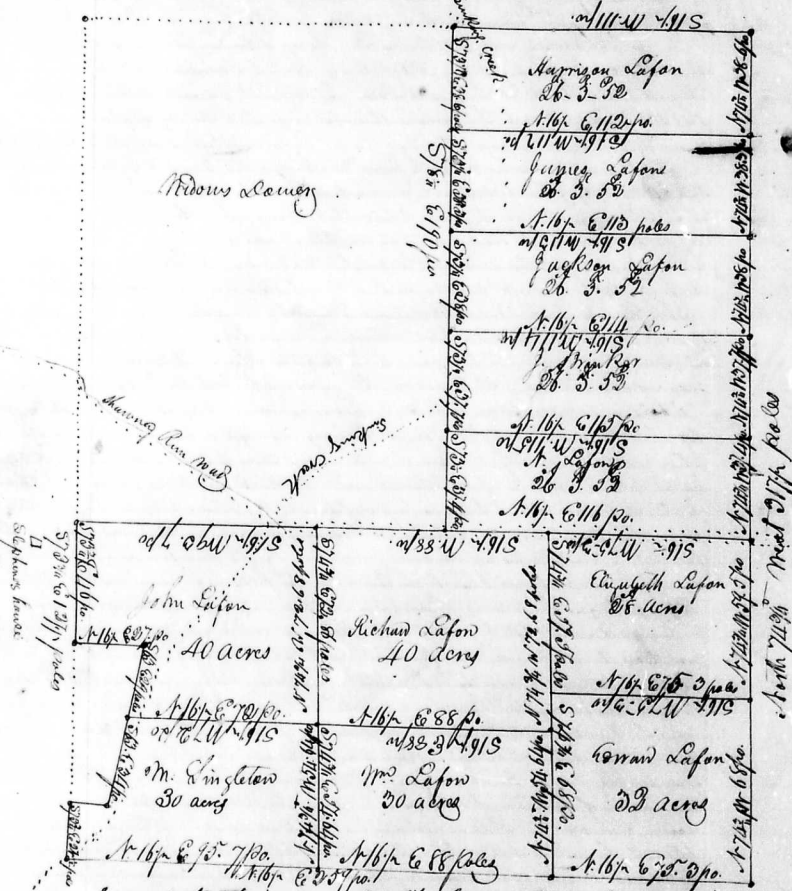

son or daughter as the case may be of him or should live and my step daughter Martha
Ann Morehead and it is my wish and desire that my trustees well please my
estate named in a deed of trust executed by me to them together with all other
estates acquired by them or their attorney with the rents profits issues and increase
thereof into the hands of my husband Henry Morehead to be held by him my said
husband for the joint benefit of my infant son or daughter as the case may
be and my step daughter Martha Ann Morehead and their heirs. And it is my
wish and desire that my said husband Henry Morehead shall have the estate aforesaid
with the rents profits issues and increase thereof during his natural life,
and appropriate the same to the joint maintenance comfort and support of
my infant and his or her heirs and my step daughter Martha Ann or her
heirs and any way which my said husband shall think proper to do from time to
time. And my husband Henry may at any time during his natural life
dispose of the whole or any part of the estate and appropriate the proceeds thereof
in any other way which he may think proper for the joint benefit of my
infant son or daughter and his or her heirs and for the benefit of my step
daughter Martha Ann and her heirs, in the event of the death of either of
my infant or my step daughter Martha Ann, without lawful issue, so that

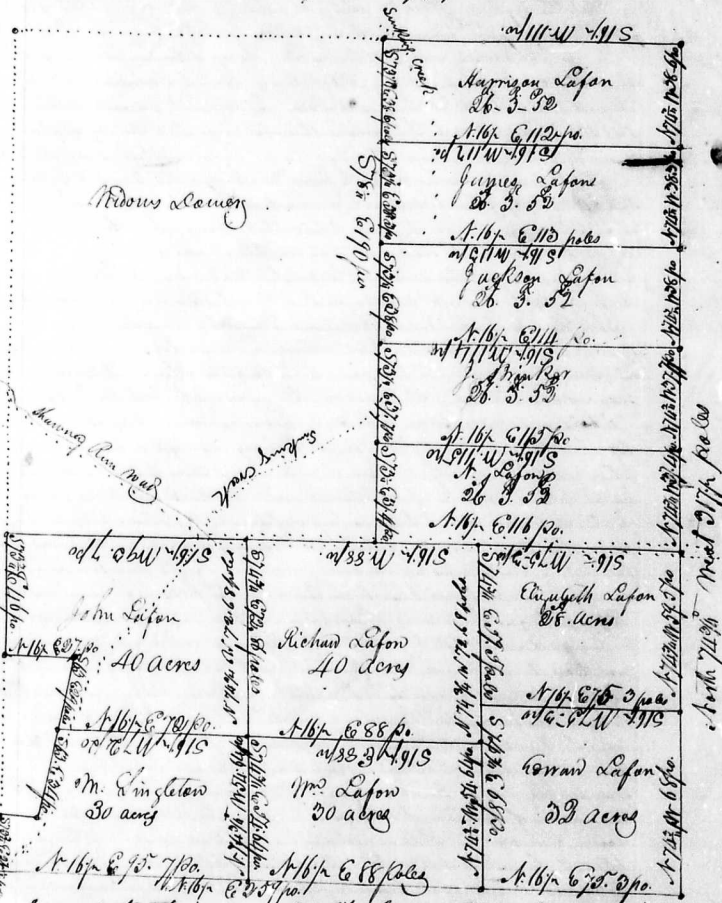
