The undersigned Commissioners appointed by the honorable Jefferson County Court at their October Court for 1833 for the purpose of settling Sarah Blackburn widow of John Blackford dec'd her dower in said Blackford's estate, have discharged the duty assigned them to the best of their judgment and have made two reports, viz: (The first of said reports by said student contained 1983 Acre, of which we have had a copy of the County Surveyor as he thinks only correct. Beginning at a stone in the middle of the Hickman road &c. corner of said tract on the old line with as Dwyer's line, thence with said line N 1/4 N 1/4 P. a stone at the top of said line with the center of said line N 2 1/4 E 107 1/2 P to an old stone N 6 1/2 E 67 1/2 P to a stone in the middle of said road in the corner of said line, thence with said line to the beginning. - We find the total area of said estate supposed to be sold to be \$293.18 after deducting the total amt. of debt against the estate which is \$211.50 cl. It leaves a balance due the estate of \$81.68 of which last amount the widow's share will be \$39.56. She having purchased at the sale of \$43.75 leave her indebted to the estate \$39.56. (There is also held an account thought to be worth nothing) to the amt. of \$114 not taken into the first estimate of which amt. the widow will be entitled to one third of whatever may be collected. (The foregoing said estate consist of one negro man supposed to be worth \$55. One old woman & child supposed to be worth \$25 amounting in the whole to \$80. The widow's third of said negro will be \$27. From the situation of said negro we have found some difficulty in dividing same

The woman is old and infirm with a young child, consequently for present service could not be considered worth more than her maintenance. Clothing, hat, & shoes are \$2.00. The man being very unmanageable a bill has been sent on the legislative power in reference to appointing a commissioner to sell said negro and vest the money in another for the benefit of the estate and as there is a great probability of said negro being sold, we have thought it advisable to give the widow for thirds of said negro in the negro man sale or out of said money he may see fit (in the event of his being sold) he does however to be regulated by the sale of the negro man (if sold) as he may sell for more or less than the supposed value. — All of which is respectfully submitted and beg to be discharged from further duty.
