In the name of God amen. I William Oliver of Lepanum County do make and publish the following to be my last will & testament viz. That my wife use occupy and enjoy the benefit of the tract of land with its appurtenances on which I now live during her life for her support and for the maintenance of my children until they arrive to the age of twenty years or as long as they live together, and for the same purpose she is at liberty to draw as much of the stock of horses, cattle, hogs, sheep, &c. house hold and kitchen furniture and farming utensils as she may think necessary, and the residue of my estate to be disposed of according to law by my executors. After the death of my wife I will that the estate and personal remaining be sold and equally divided among my children. To carry this in & will into execution I appoint my wife Elizabeth and my son Jacob B. Oliver my executors. In testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 30th day of August 1833.
