I Give to my son Samuel Barkley one Negro Boy Anderson Richly Child I give Isaac Bonston and my Daughter Sarah Bonston three Negroes Rachael her son John and daughter Sally I give to my son James Barkley all the tract of Land on which I now live, and also thirty five acres of Land I bought of Hops & his heirs adjoining to the Roberts and others I likewise give to my said son James the following Negroes to wit Allen Harry Wells Major and Eagle and do hereby regard and assign upon him to treat the said Eagle and Major with great kindness and tenderness during their natural lives because of their long and faithful service to me and my family I likewise give to said James my eight day clock my nigger gary boom and farming utensils and all the grain which may be on the place at my death I give to my Grand son Elbert Price three Negroes Jordan Polly and Jimmy. I give to Martha Ann Withers one Negro woman Lucy. I give Polly Price one Negro boy Henry Lucys child. I give to Eliza Price one Negro boy Peter Lucys child. It is further my will that all the residue of my Estate undivided of shall be equally divided between my son John Barkley the heir of my son George Barkley. I do hereby constitute Samuel Barkley and John Garrison the executors of this my last will and testament. In remembrance whereof I have hereunto set my name and affixed my seal this sixth day of April 1827

In the name of God Amen I Thomas Richly of the County of Jefferson and State of Kentucky being of sound mind and disposing memory blessed be the Almighty who is the giver of all good for this I do hereby will and bequeath all my estate of every kind and nature in manner and form following to wit First it is my will and desire that all my just debts be first paid and thanks be to God they are but few. And I bind to my wife Martha Richly the tract of land whereon I now live containing about 112 acres during her natural life also all my personal estate of every kind or nature after paying the following portions to my six children to wit Richard Richly one cow and calf and no more which is to be his full share of all my estate both real personal or mixed he having no married wife. To my three daughters Betsy Peggy and Nancy sixty dollars each. To my daughter Patsy one hundred and twenty dollars and my said John one hundred and twenty dollars the above sums to be paid in property to my six children may need it or my said wife and have it to share undisturbed for as the object is to make them all equal in property the balance of my childrens having no 2<sup>d</sup> and 3<sup>d</sup> of 120 off he share. Then I give and bequeath to my daughter Betsy Roberts fifty dollars in cash and no more. Having herebefore no advanced her full share of all my estate both real personal and mixed. Then I give and bequeath to my daughter four sons Thomas Robert Benjamin and John Richly a certain tract of Land in the County of Clark and State of Indiana containing 205 acres to be equally divided

between the said four sons to them and their heirs for ever. Then I give and bequeath to my four daughters Betsy Peggy Nancy and Patsy one house and lot containing one half acre in the County of Clark near the town of Winchester Kentucky to them the said four daughters and their heirs forever. And further it is my will and desire that after the death of my wife Martha that the Tract of Land lent to her to gather with all the balance of my estate not herebefore devised be equally divided between my eight children to wit Betsy Thomas Robert Peggy Nancy Benjamin Patsy or Martha and John. Then and their heirs forever. And lastly I constitute and appoint my two sons Thomas Richly and Benjamin Richly my sole executors of this my last will and testament revoking all other will or wills by me herebefore made. Son of Peter being in called to draw first drew Randolph appraised to \$225 cash legal being entitled to \$212.25 cents in the value of 2 slaves the pay \$12.75 cents Harvey Trimble drew legal at 275 and paid 62.75 cents Franklin Trimble drew legal at \$200 and received \$2.25 cents James Trimble drew legal a woman at \$250 and paid \$17.75 cents John Trimble drew a mule at \$94 and paid \$7.75 cents Andrew Trimble drew either and legal two girls at \$175 and received \$27.75 cents James Trimble drew James a boy at \$125 and received \$44.25 cents Apollon Trimble drew a girl Chyrinda at \$150 and received \$62.25 cents given under our hand & seal this 25 of September 1828
