The undersigned commissioners appointed by the Jefferson County Court to settle with the Adms^r of David Hoover's estate and allot to the widow of said dec^d her dower, having attended to the duties assigned them beg leave to report as follows: We find that the said Adms^r are chargeable with \$1147.13 1/2 the amount of sales as per sale bill and \$318.87 1/2 the amount received by the widow at the appraisal valued \$358.07 1/2 the amount due open accounts and cash.

\$1665.87 1/2 amt of sale of the tract of land

\$4489.96 making together the sum of \$6155.83 1/2 of the above amount was open accounts against the heirs for money advances to them by the intestate in his life time and not intended to be collected. And \$117.07 1/2 in notes and open accounts against persons who have proved to be insolvent

305 making together \$1038.57 1/2 which being deducted from \$4489.96 leaves \$3451.38 1/2 the amt which the adms^r are properly chargeable with and upon which we have allowed them 5 per cent commission amounting to \$172.569. We find that the Adms^r have disbursed for expenses and debts exclusive of legacies \$145.75. Add to this \$173.369 (this commission) makes the sum of \$319.119 which being deducted from the \$3451.38 1/2 leaves \$3132.26 1/2 which is the net amt of the estate. One third of this sum we have allotted to the widow as her dower say \$1044.42 1/2. The Adms^r have disbursed to the heirs as part of their legacies the sum of \$1401.69 1/2 leaving a balance in the hands of the Adms^r of \$697.17 1/2 according to the foregoing account which is respectfully submitted to the Court.

I Thomas Roberts of the county of Jessamine and state of Kentucky being afflicted of body but of sound and disposing mind and memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in manner and form following (viz). I lend unto my beloved wife Sarah Roberts during her natural life all the land contained in the tract wherein I now live together with five of my slaves three males and two females to be chosen by herself also as much of my stock farming utensils and household and kitchen furniture as she may think necessary for her use. All the balances of my estate I will to be sold to the best advantage and the money arising therefrom to be equally divided amongst my children and at any time if my wife should give up any of the portion I loan her then that is to be equally divided amongst my children my debts having been first paid by my Executors, and after my beloved wife's death it is my will that that portion I loan her with what other estate may be in my executors hands be sold to the best advantage and equally divided amongst my law children or their legal representatives after first taking into consideration what they have already received which is as follows to wit. I have given to my son Joseph Roberts sixteen hundred and twenty five dollars and to my daughter Jane Foley I have given twelve hundred and twenty dollars to Ann Roberts thirteen hundred and eighty dollars to my daughter Mary Brinker I have given eight hundred and sixteen dollars to John Roberts eleven hundred and thirty three dollars to Sarah Morrison I have given seven hundred and and four teen dollars and to Thomas Roberts six fourteen hundred and forty three dollars to Andrew Allen one thousand and twenty nine dollars and to John Roberts fifteen hundred and nineteen dollars and to Rankin Roberts I have given fourteen hundred and forty nine the several sums as named above I have given to my children as named which they have hitherto received my Estate is directed to be so divided by my Executors that what I have already given is to be counted and all of the children made equal except my deceased daughter Mary Brinker it is my will that my Executors retain in their hands one equal share of my Estate which they are directed to give an equal portion to my three grand children Joseph Brinker Mary Jane Brinker Marianne Brinker and my great granddaughters Mary C Brinker equally when they marry or come of age and my executors are not to be charged with interest on that portion until the funds until after they marry or come of age I charge my great grand daughter Mary C Brinker with one hundred dollars of her portion which I gave to her father before his death and lastly I appoint my wife Sarah Roberts my two sons James and John Roberts and Greenburg Allen my Executors to this my last will and testament revoking all former wills by me made in testimony whereof I have affixed my hand the fourth day of March 1850

I Thomas Roberts make this codicil to my will. Whereas I hold three notes on the Robert Jans for about two thousand dollars assigned to me by John Foley also a mortgage given to said Foley by Mr. Roberts to secure the payment of said notes which is assigned to me and whereas the Robert Jans own one half of the tract of land to his sister Jane Foley intending to retain fifty acres himself. Now it is my desire that this property should be divided between them that is my daughter Jane and my son Thomas in the manner in which they each hold possession of the premises and to that end my will is that after Thomas Roberts executing to Jane Foley a deed of conveyance for fifty acres the tract of land she holds that my executors shall forbear from the collection of said two notes on Thomas Roberts until my daughter releases her dower in said fifty acres held by the Robert Jans and when she releases dower therein my executors shall proceed to collect from the Robert Jans such sum of money as in addition to what he has formerly paid as will make one half of the original purchase price of the whole tract with interest. This sum so collected I give to said Jane Foley and the remainder of said two notes my executors are directed to release as also the mortgage on the premises to said the Robert Jans but it is understood that as I receive no consideration from the Robert Jans and Jane Foley that my estate is not to be responsible if this arrangement by any means whatever is rendered ineffectual.
