I Charles Chowning of the county of Jefferson and State of Kentucky, being sick of body, but of sound mind and disposing memory do make and ordain this my last will and testament in the manner and form following, I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Elizabeth the plantation on which I now live with all its appurtenances and improvements during her natural life, unless there should not be a sufficient quantity of timber to support the farm, but if such should be the case, I desire the land to be sold, and my five youngest children to receive, each a horse load of a common quality, and a saddle, a cow and feather bed & furniture, her followers their names which are to receive the above mentioned legacy, James, Eliza, Lucy, (Demaria and Mary Linn) and if there should be any thing more, I wish it to be equally divided amongst the above named and those whose names follow, John, Charles, Peter, Henry and Linda to have the benefit of the above during her natural life, and also one hundred pounds to dispose of at her death as she may think fit. I give to Eliza Chowning (daughter of my son William Chowning) dec'd fifty pounds, to the three children of my daughter Sally (Bartholomew Williams three children) I also give fifty pounds to be equally divided amongst them. To my son Thomas Chowning I give one hundred dollars which is to be paid on a final division of my property after the death of my wife, the balance after paying the above legacies I desire to have equally divided amongst my children here following John, Charles, Peter, Eliza, James, Eliza, Lucy, (Demaria and Mary Linn), I nominate Elizabeth and myself my wife Elizabeth Chowning and my son John Chowning executors to carry out my last will and testament into effect.
