Wife my Negroes and Moveable effects for
her Support and at her ^{death} and John Blains
Management and at her death the said
Estate to be sold Consisting Negroes Horses
Cattle Hogs Sheep and my household stuff
of all kinds after the ^{sale} ~~say~~ Nancy Shae-
- before James Blain and Hannah
McKinstry is to have twenty Pounds
to be paid to each of them before any
other division also I give and Bequeath
to my son John Blain the said
tract of Land I now live on, Contain-
-ing 300 Acres with all its appurten-
-ances also I give and Bequeath to my
Daughter Sarah Murri 100 Acres of the
said tract with its appurtenances My
patent Lands lying on the Water of Lake-
-ary after John Martin gets one Share
of it for Location according to quantity
Quality I Constable Hannah Blain James
Vth. Mary Bly (Improver) says Blain or John Blain
Blain to Make the said Martin

Joseph right from me and my heirs
 to him and his heirs or assigns and
 no further and the remainder of the
 Land to be divided in the manner and
 form following also I give and Bequeath
 to my son George Blain 200 Acres of
 Land Out of the said tract lying on
 the Waters of Locking also I give and
 Bequeath to my son John Blain
 300 Acres of the said tract and the
 remainder 300 to be sold and added
 to the Principal sum that the Negroes
 and Stock will bring and then to be
 Equally divided amongst the now men-
 tioned Legates Margot Gay Jean Mont-
 gomery Nancy Shackelford also Wm
 Jay James Blain Hannah McHenry
 and Sarah Murrel One half Share I further
 Order that my Executor as soon as
 Money can be raised out of my Estate

the Clerk out of the office the Saxes of
 the Orphans of Samuel Demarest and
 make a return and I do hereby Ut-
 terly Disallow revoke and Disannul all
 and Every other former Testaments wills
 Legacies Bequests and Executory by me
 in any way before named Witha and
 Bequeathen ratifying and Confirming
 this and no other to be my last
 Will and Testament in witness where-
 of I have hereunto set my hand and
 seal this Twelfth of April One thousand seven
 hundred and Ninety Two Signed
 sealed Published Pronounced and
 Declared by the said Alexander Blain
 as his last Will and Testament in the
 presence of us who in his Presence were
 in Presence of each other have become
 to subscribers our names
