 pher Sutton being of perfect sense & Memory
 calling to remembrance that it is appointed for
 all men once to die do make and declare
 this my last Will & Testament. Viz. That of
 all I recommend my soul to God and my body
 to the auld to be buried in a Christian

manner and to dispose of my worldly Estate
 In manner and Form as follows To wit
 It is my desire that my beloved wife Sarah
 shall have the whole and sole possession of all
 my moveable property after my decease which
 I have given each of my sons and Daughters one
 Negroe which they have now in possession except
 my son James which I give my Negroe boy
 Bristol to take immediately in possession after my
 decease and further give the two young negroes
 sent to Jackman for the land uterine slave
 and desire that he may not be called on by
 my heirs for any part of that property and
 one third part of all my Stock. And my
 desire at the Death of my wife that the
 remaining part of my Estate may be equally
 divided amongst my sons and Daughters
 I also give to my son James Sullons one
 feather bed and Furniture and appoint my
 beloved wife and Richard Jackman Ex^{rs} of
 this my last Will & Testament. In Witness
 I have set my hand and seal this twelfth
 day of June 1793

 who made oath and executed and acknowledged
 Bond as the said aucts certificate is granted
 them for obtaining letters of Administration
 with the Will annexed the Executor and
 Executor therein named having personally
 appeared in Court and refused to take upon
 themselves the burthen of the Execution thereof
