In the name of God Amen - I Jacob Jones of the aforesaid Fort being weak in body, but sound & in perfect memory, thanks be to God for the same, But knowing that life is uncertain, I do make & Ordain this my last Will and Testament Revoking all Wills by me heretofore made.

I give and bequeath unto my son Abner Jones, One shilling sterling, for his part of my Estate, more than what he has had.

I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Jones, One shilling sterling, for his part of my Estate, more than what he has had.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Knott One shilling sterling for her part of my Estate, more than what she has had.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Elizabeth Jones, One Feather Bed and Furniture, and One Flax Wheel, to be received, when she separates from her Mother, also One half the property of my Negro Wench Tager, at my Wifes Death or Marriage, to be received and not before.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Sarah Jones One Feather Bed & Furniture, and One

Flax Wheel, to be received when she separates from her Mother, also the other half of the property of my Negro Wench Tager, to be by her received at my Wifes Death or Marriage & not before.

I give unto my son Abner Jones, my Negro Boy Ben, One Bed and Furniture, and all my working tools of all kinds, but nothing to be by him received till my Wifes Death, or Marriage, except her consent thereto.

all the rest of my Personal Estate, not yet given before my Just Debts is paid, I leave my Wife Elizabeth Jones & my have the benefit of during her natural life, in Widowhood, and after her Marriage or Death, the same to be equally divided between my three Children, Viz Elizabeth Jones, Sarah Jones & Abner Jones.

Lastly, I constitute my loving Wife, Elizabeth Jones Executrix of my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have set my hand and seal this 19th May 1780.

At a County Court held for Lincoln County the
15th day of March 1796 This Will was proved
by John Atkinson the only surviving Witness thereto,
who made oath that the said Will is in his said
attorney's hand writing at the request of the said Jacob
Jones And was Ordered to be recorded which on the
petition of Atty Jones who made oath and with
Leaves Bowdoin his Security entered into and acknowledged
Bond in the penalty of Two hundred pounds Conditioned
as the law directs A Certificate of Authentication
with the Will annexed of the said Decedent's Estate
is granted him.
