remain in her hands under her care for the purpose
of raising and schooling her children that is yet under
age and unmarried and further it is my will that
my wife should out said Estate to each of my
children as they arrive at lawful ages or be married

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as much in property as I have generally given
to those of my Children already married but it
shall be left to her own judgement how much
and in what kind of property to give to make
them equal and further it is my will that as soon
as my money and outstanding debts can be collected
that my executrix and my executor, to purchase a
negro or negro with the same and that said purchase
shall also remain in my wife's hands until her death
and at her Decease the said purchase together with
all the rest of estate be equally divided on all
my Children but further if my should hereafter ^{change to} marry
in that case I will and bequeath to her only one
full third of all my estate both real and personal
during her life and at her death to descend as above
directed and the balance of estate at the time of her marriage
to go to the use of my Children and I do constitute and
appoint my wife and my son John Ganters my exe-
cutrix and executor to this my last will and testament
in witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
affixed my seal this day of November 1804
