I Jane Kirkpatrick
of Lincoln County and State of
Kentucky, Being in sound mind and
memory but feeling to mind the mor-
tality of my Body and that it is appoin-
ted for all men once to die do make
and declare this my Last Will and
Testament: Item my will and desire
is that all my Just and lawful Debts

be first Paid and the Residue of
my Estate to be Divided as here after
shall be Directed.

Item: I Give to my well beloved Wife
Agnes the Plantation whereon I live
to her proper Use and Benefit during
her Natural Life and after her death
my Will and desire is that the Land
and Plantation be sold to John Bro-
nough and his heirs by Paying unto
Thomas Martin and James Hannah
Each my Debtors, Each the sum of
one hundred Pounds, in four yearly
payments of fifty Pounds a year without
Interest to be equally Divided between
them and if he doth not take the Land
by paying the before mentioned sum
my Will and desire is that the Land
be Equally Divided between the afore-
said Thomas Martin and James Hannah: -

Item: I Give to my ^{wife} beloved Wife Agnes
one Negro woman named Winah her
Dress and the boy that she may Chase

Kentucky, Being in sound mind and
memory but feeling to mind the mor-
tality of my Body and that I am appoin-
ted for all men once to die do make
and ordain this my Last Will and
Testament: Item my will and desire
is that all my just and lawful Debts

be first Paid and the Residue of
my Estate to be Divided as here after
shall be directed:

Item: I Give to my well beloved Wife
Agnes the Plantation whereon I live
to her proper Use and Benefit during
her Natural Life and after her death
my Will and desire is that the Land
and Plantation be sold to John Bro-
nough and his heirs by Paying unto
Thomas Martin and James Hannah
Each my Heiress, Each the Sum of
one hundred Pounds, in four yearly
payments of fifty Pounds a year without
Interest to be equally Divided between
them and if he doth not take the Land
by paying the before mentioned Sum
my Will and desire is that the Land
be Equally Divided between the afore-
said Thomas Martin and James Hannah: -
Item: I Give to my ^{well} beloved Wife Agnes
one Negro woman named Dinah her
Wife and the half that she may Choose

to be at her own disposal.

I then: I lend to my Wife Agnes two
Sons Breads and Three Cows for
the use of the Plantation during
her Natural life and at her Death
my Will and Desire is they be sold
and Equally Divided Between Thomas
Martin and James Hannah

I then: my will and desire is that
all my Stock be sold; except what has
been Excepted in order to pay my Lawful
debts.

I then: I lend my Wife ^{Agnes} all my house-
hold and Kitchen furniture and all
my farming Utensils during her Natural
life and at her death my Will is that
the same be sold and equally divided
Between Thomas Martin and James
Hannah both my Nephews.

I then: I Give unto Jane Branaugh
late Gilmore wife to John Branaugh
one Negro Girl named Amy and her
Increase to her and her heirs in lieu
of

of fifty Pounds, the Value of the Planta-
tion as agreed on by James Gilmore and
my Self

I then: I lend my wife Agnes one Negro
Woman named Lucy to her use and
benefit during her natural life
and after her Death my Will & Desire
that the aforesaid Negro Woman be
Thomas Martin my Nephew but if
sold my Will is that he receive of
James Hannah one half of her price.

I then: I lend my Wife Agnes a Negro
man named Peter to her use and
benefit during her natural life and
after her Death my Will is that the
aforesaid Peter be sold to James Hannah
my Nephew and his heirs

I then: I lend to my Wife Agnes a Negro
Girl named Fan, to her use and benefit
during her natural life and after her
Death my Will is that the aforesaid
Negro Girl be sold unto James Black
and his heirs, Son of William Black with
all her increase:

I Item. I leave my Wife Agnes & Negro Boy named Peuben to her use and Benefit During her natural Life and after ^{her} Death my Will is that the Appovsaia Negro Peuben Decend unto Robert Collison my Brother in Law and to his heirs

I Item. I leave my Wife Agnes & Negro Girl named Sall to her use and Benefit During her natural Life and after her Death my Will is that the Appovsaia Sall Decend unto James Hannah my Nephew with her increase to her heirs

I Item. I leave my Wife Agnes & Negro Boy named Aaron to her use and Benefit During her natural Life and after Death my Will is that the Appovsaia Aaron Decend unto George Kirkpatrick my Brother John Kirkpatrick's Son and to his heirs. -

I Item. My Will and Desire is to give unto Abraham Collison Son of John Collison my Brother in Law and to his

heirs the first Child that a Negro Woman Sucky hath and if she hath two my Will is to Give the Second unto Mary Martin and her heirs wife to Jacob Martin my Nephew -

I Item. my Will is that after the residue of the increase of said Sucky if any be. Divided Between Thomas Martin and James Hannah and their heirs my Nephew -

I Item my Will is that after the life Expires which is in March 1300. which I gave John Perrough that the Direction of my Plantation and farm be under the Direction of my Executors as they think best.

I Item. I do hereby Declare and signat all and every will or Wills made and acknowledged before the Date hereof

I Item. I do hereby Appoint, my well beloved Wife Agnes and my trusty friend William Black my Executors to this my last Will and testament sealed Signed and

Acknowledged this Sixteenth Day of
April in the Year of Our Lord one
thousand Eight hundred & seven 1807

The word be interlined in the sixteenth
line: And the word appoint in the
Eighty Sixth line before signed.

day of October 1807 the last Will and
testament James Kirkpatrick Dec^d was
Exhibited into Court and prove by the oath
of James Hickman Robert Grayhame
and Anthony Hume. Subscribing Witnesses
thereof and the same was ordered to be
Recorded: And on the motion of William
Black one of the Executors named in
the said Will, who made oath as the

Law direct, and Dec^d Bond in the penalty
of \$2000 with Thomas Hutton
and Absolam Halison his Security Condi-
tioned according to Law Decree that
A Certificate of the probate thereof be
granted him in due form of Law
Reserving to Agnes Kirkpatrick the
Executor named in the said Will
the privilege of hereafter qualifying
if she may think proper
