it is once appointed for all men to die  
do make and ordain this my Last Will  
and Testament that is to say particular  
I give of all I give & recommend my soul  
to God that gave it as to my body I recommend  
it to the Earth to be buried in a Christian  
like Manner at the discretion of my Ex-  
ecutors Nothing doubting but at the general  
Resurrection I shall receive the same by the  
Power of Almighty God and touching of  
such worldly affairs goods as it has pleased  
God to bestow on me with I give & assign  
I dispose of the same in the following manner  
I give to wit,

First It is my will and so ordain all  
my just debts and funeral charges to be paid  
and satisfied I then give and bequeath  
to my beloved Wife Sarah Nicholson all

long as she may remain a widow and my poor  
afflicted son ~~Reuben~~ Robert Nicholson  
all my estate both real and personal  
Then give and bequeath after the death  
of my wife to my two sons five pounds  
apiece William Nicholson four pounds  
James Nicholson five pounds To Betsey  
Robertson five pounds and I give & bequeath  
after the death of my son Robert if he  
should be a long time than his mother  
and at both of their deaths my desire  
is that a real divide be made amongst  
my three Children William Betsey James  
Item I do hereby appoint constitute and  
ordain William Dowsley and Francis Da-  
vis my Executors of this my Last Will  
and Testament and so hereby certify as  
an act and make void all other wills  
or Wills Testaments or Testaments  
and Executors by me ~~made~~ hereto-  
fore made certifying and confirming  
me

no other to be my last will and testament

Executors administrators or assigns forever  
I likewise give & bequeath my share or  
legal part of my deceased father Thomas  
Good's Estate that now may remain due
