all my moneys owing me and in my possession
also all interest in lands and all and every
thing I die possessed of together ^{both} real & personal
I will & bequeath unto my beloved wife
Mary M Henderson to her and her heirs
forever it is farther my will & desire
that all my possessions in the town of Standford
be sold by my executors at a twelve month
credit at public vendue lastly I ordain
and appoint Samuel Beard my Beloved wife
Mary Henderson & John Craig my executors
to this my last will and testament

in the year 1804

sound mind & memory do make and ordain this
my last will and testament VIZ first I will &
bequeath to my son Marshall Allen all the
land I am entitled to under a contract with
David Sagan bearing date the 12th of September
1803 except one hundred acres to inclose the
houses where I now live and other improvements
the one hundred acres to be laid off in a good
in a good form second I will & bequeath

bequeath to my daughter Lucy Giles a negro
girl called Cather now in my possession as the
whole of her right to my estate I leave give
him possession of said negro then I bequeath
I will that whole residue of my estate shall
remain in the hands possession of my wife Re-
becca during her life upon this condition
that as my children namely James Allen
Churchwell Allen Thomas Allen Rebecca
Allen Gabriel & Allen and Lucille Allen
because of lawfull age that she shall
each of them out of my estate with a
House worth twenty pounds fourth I will
that at my wife Rebecca what ever remains
of my shall be equally divided among the
whole of children except Lucy Giles who
I conceive has now got her equal proportion
in the negro girl Cather fifth I will that
if it should be the pleasure of my son
Churchwell Allen who I leave as my executor
to have any part of the property I have will

to the rest of my children except Lucy
Giles he is at liberty to do it by
accounting for them for the amount
writing my hand and seal this 26th day
of July 1804

Allen was exhibited into Court & sworn by the oaths of David
Simpson & Daniel Hudgins of the subscribing witnesses thereof
persons to be received and on the motion of the said James Allen
the Court granted and allowed to the said James Allen who made oath that
lawfully a certificate is granted him of the probate thereof
and as found he having intimated according to his power in the probate
of the will with David Simpson James Ballenger & Daniel Hudgins
as witnesses according to law (Witness the Court & every Clerk)
