And through the permission of God I John Barnett Son of Lincoln county now master of lingering indisposition but possessed of my senses rational faculties do in the presence of the witnesses here under signed make and declare this Instrument of writing to be my last will and testament and do make hereby all other statements Declarations or writings in the first place it is and I do declare it as my will that my executors should have met at the at the highest Spring meeting house such way and manner as they may think proper and have the same valued in in accordingly to the second place it is my will that my executors should pay all my just debts and I do will that all my estate of every description shall be disposed of in following manner to wit By Executors that I do will to the children of my wife of my half sister Polly wife of Charles Moore my dear boy man called buff coat and a red and white heifer called ^{Rocky} Hays to their use and equal proportion Secondly I will to Anne Barnett daughter

Daughter of Robert Barnett twenty pained
I do will that my executor shall out of the
money arising out of my estate give to
William Mundy of Montgomery county in the state
of Virginia the sum of sixty dollars thirty dollars
of which to his daughter Betty Mundy it being
for their first money and some which I do ^{leave} for them
I do will that my executor shall as soon as my
two negro girls situa and Leah ^{be} sent to
to spin glass hemp wool &c & that they shall
then ~~be~~ sent to Kent ^{and} after they acquired the knowledge
of the above business they shall ~~be~~ sent out and
to be kept at those businesses and I do in the next
place will that my executor shall sell all the
residue of my estate real mixed and personal
at such time in such manner and upon such
terms whether private or public sales as to them
may seem best and most proper and to
carry transfer and do whatever is right
to be done relative thereto and I do hereby ^{acknowledge} ~~acknowledge~~ ^{for me as}
and direct all the proceeds thereof and also my
Bond bequeath said negroes and images and
every thing whatever except the bequeath above mentioned
to my ^{little} child recognized and my child called &
named Green Barnett now in the care and
of Susanah Gibbs except my dark Chestnut colored
Horse called Speed which I will to Joseph Hall

And my will and desire is that my little child
Green Barnett shall be well educated and married
brought up until twenty one years of age unless he shall
die before he comes to the age of twenty one ^{years} that
thereupon all which I have ~~written~~ ^{hereby} into him here
and which he should ^{hereby} claim and have shall be equally
divided share and share alike among the children
of Joseph Hall and my sister Anne Hall his wife
together begotten and the children of my brother
James Barnett begotten by his present wife & my will
and desire is that my executor hereafter named
shall act as guardian for my said son and
child Green until he comes to the age of
twenty one and I do hereby constitute & appoint
Joseph Hall and John Welch Executors of this
my last will and testament ^{in writing} I have
hereunto subscribed my names and affixed
my seal this fifteenth day of March in the year
of our Lord one thousand eight hundred & five
but I do further declare it is my will and desire
that my little child Green Barnett shall be
well clothed at all times agreeable to ^{the} season
and all moneys that may and shall be raised
by my Executors that shall arise from the
produce of of my estate shall be ^{kept} out of

out and ordered for his benefit Except such part
as I have otherwise devised in such hands

in this life I Give Devise and dispose of the same
in the following manner and form. First I give
and bequeath to Mary my beloved wife the
plantation where I now reside together with all
my household goods ~~debt~~ & Chattels now in
my possession or on premises to be by her fully
possessed and enjoyed during her life time then
to be devised in form ~~thereafter~~ mentioned I like
ise constitute make and ordain my wife the
Sole Executrix of this my last will and testam-
ent also I give to my beloved sons William
Dugan & John Dugan Three hundred and Eighty
nine Aers of land lying in Campbell County
near Grants Salt Works patented in my own name
and ~~returned~~ ^{in my name}
to be equally Divided in quality and quantity
between them both I also give to my other beloved
Son and daughter the residue of my property
in the form and manner hereafter mentioned viz
to my sons in law Armstrong Hen and John
Rogers & my daughter Polly Dugan Peggy Dugan
Barney Dugan
and my son Suball Dugan the plantation lying
