 being sick and weak in body but of perfect
 mind and memory thanks be given unto God

calling to mind the mortality of ^{my body} and knowing that
 it is appointed for all men to die do make
 and ordain this my this my last will &
 testament and as touching such worldly estate
 wherewith it has pleased God to Bless me with in
 in this life I give Devise and dispose of the same
 in the following manner and form. First I give
 and bequeath to Mary my beloved wife the
 plantation where I now reside together with all
 my household goods ~~debt~~ & Chattels now in
 my possession or on premises to be by her fully
 possessed and enjoyed during her life time then
 to be devised in form ~~thereafter~~ mentioned. I then
 do constitute make and ordain my wife the
 Sole Executrix of this my last will and testam-
 ent also. I give to my beloved sons William
 Dugan & John Dugan three hundred and eighty
 nine acres of land lying in Campbell County
 near Grants Salt Works patented in my own name
 and ~~returned~~ ^{in my name}
 to be equally divided in quality and quantity
 between them both I also give to my other beloved
 son and daughter the residue of my property
 in the form and manner hereafter mentioned viz
 to my sons in law Armstrong Hen and John
 Rogers & my daughter Polly Dugan Peggy Dugan
 Barbara Dugan
 and my son Suball Dugan the plantation lying

John & John Rogers the first of which is to have one hundred and forty dollars left them my daughter Polly Peggy & Mary Dugan & John Dugan one hundred & twenty five dollars each the rest to each have equal part to be by their freely enjoyed and disposed And I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all and every other former testament wills legacies bequests by me in any will fornamed written and bequeathed Ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament the Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 10th day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and four John Dugan (seal)

Whom I know well with all building Appertinences and premises therunto belonging as mentioned in my Wife's part or any thing that may properly belong thereto to have and hold the same after her Decease in equal Division except amongst Her & John Rogers the first of which is to have one hundred and forty ^{five} dollars left them my daughter Polly Peggy & Mary Dugan & John Dugan one hundred & twenty five dollars each the rest to each have equal part to be by their freely enjoyed and disposed And I do hereby utterly disavow revoke and disannul all and every other former testament wills legacies bequests by me in any will fornamed written and bequeathed Ratifying & confirming this and no other to be my last will & testament the Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal this 10th day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and four John Dugan (seal)

I Jacob Gentry of Lincoln County and State of Kentucky being weak in body but of sound mind and memory thanks be to God for all his Mercies and knowing that it is appointed for all men once to die I do make constitute and appoint this my last will and testament hereby revoking all other wills or wills by me heretofore made in public and first I will that my Executors and executors hereinafter mentioned to pay all my all Just and Lawful debts secondly I leave and bequeath to my beloved wife Ruth all the remainder of my estate both real and personal on the following terms to wit that it is to remain in her hands under her care for the purpose of raising and schooling her children that is yet under age and unmarried and further it is my will that my wife should out said Estate to each of my children as they arrive at lawful ages or be married
