in the manner following First I order all my Just
and lawfull Debts to be paid and I do leave to
my beloved wife Rebecca One Negroe Wench during
her lifetime and one bow and half an bow and

Furniture and one Man known by name of the
 blue Man and her living off the land while she
 lives and all the Kitchen Furniture at her own
 Disposal and I do bear and bequeath to my
 two Oldest sons Samuel and John Givens one Dollar
 each, and I do bear to my sons Robert, James &
 Allen Givens Two Pounds each and I bear to
 my son Elizer Givens One hundred acres of Land
 the land lately bought from Mr. Lowells to him
 and his heirs forever and all the Plantation
 Utensils with all my other Personal Estate and
 of the above Negro Wench bequeath to the number of
 three children during my wife's lifetime I do Order
 that my son Robert's daughter Sarah Mitchell Givens
 shall have the share and the part to my son James
 and the part to my son James and the part to
 Allen Givens and the said Wench to be my son Elizer's
 at his Mother's death and I do Order and constitute
 my two sons Robert and Elizer Givens to be my
 sole and sole Executors of this my last Will &
 Testament Given Under my hand and seal
