In the name of God Amen I John
Dealing of Lincoln County and State of Kentucky

being in a low State of body but of sound memory and
mind calling to mind the mortality of man do make
this my last Will and Testament, first of all I give
my Soul to God who gave it, and as touching my worldly
estate I give to my wife Dinah in case she should
longer than I do my Negro man Jacob to work for
her life time and after her Death to be sold and the money
divided Equally between my seven children To wit
John Estlin, William Estlin, Daniel Estlin, Benjamin
Estlin, Elizabeth Estlin and (Nelly, Erens and Sally
Whittle) and my two sons and children James & Lucy
Estlin children to James Estlin is to have one share
Equally divided between them and the whole of my estate
real and personal is to be sold and Divided agreeable
to the abovementioned Plan except the two Plantations
which John and William Estlin lives on which is to
be bounded as followeth (to wit) William Estlin
is have the land where he now lives on (beginning) at
William Pattens North West corner thence Northward
at right angles from said Pattens line as far as the
spring branch that runs through between John Estlins
sons plantation and said William Estlins

and down said branch to the Hanging Fork thence
 to continue the same course Easterly to John James
 McKinnys line thence with said line southerly
 to Edmund Powell's line thence with said line westward
 - by to William Pattens line thence with said Pattens
 line to the beginning and to John Josiah I give the
 Plantation whereon he now lives to be bounded as followeth
 (to wit) beginning at William Pattens North west
 corner thence to run Northwardly at right angles
 from said corner to the head of the Spring branch
 mentioned in William Josias bounds thence to run
 Northwardly to John Josiah Such a course as will
 include one hundred acres which mentioned lands
 John and William Josiah is to give two Dollars for
 each acre to be paid out of their Part of my Estate
 I also constitute and appoint Edmund Powell &
 William Pattens my Executors In Witness whereof I
 have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty sixth
 Day of June one Thousand seven hundred and
 Ninety three in presence of.
