In the name of God Amen  
I John Craig of Lincoln County and  
State of Kentucky being a pious Christian and  
not knowing how soon it may please  
God to call me out of this world do  
make constitute and make this my  
last will and Testament in manner &  
form following. That is to say, I bequeath  
I commend my soul into the hands  
of Almighty God my Creator hoping

and believing in his Mercy and inter-  
cession of Jesus Christ my dear Saviour  
and Merciful Saviour through his merits  
& Mediation and free Grace and Mercy  
by his almighty power I shall have  
a glorious Resurrection at the last day  
and have perfectly Blessed in all  
Enjoying of God to all Eternity.

And as to all my worldly substance  
whereunto it has pleased God to Bless  
me I give devise and Bequeath in  
manner and form following (to wit) it  
is my will that all my just debts  
and funeral charges be paid.

Item I give devise and Bequeath to  
William Craig Son of John Craig my  
Settlement whereon I now live containing  
400 Acres & 100 Acres added off, crange  
since joining Joshua fields including  
the Branch from the Field to the  
mouth. Item. I give to his Brother John  
Craig 400 Acres including the forks of

And Lick, and 800, Tanagers to be  
Equally Divided between David James  
and Charles. David and Charles next the  
River and James the Port, including the  
Branch to the settlement line I term.

I give to son James Craig the two  
settlements and preemptions to wit his  
Own and his Brother Williams which  
fell to him in Kentucky and Cumber-  
land, all which I cleared out of the office  
likewise I give to him one Feather-Bed  
and bed clothes whereon I now lie and  
if he comes to extreme want to be main-  
tained in victuals and wearing clothes  
by John Craig and Samuel Beard then  
I give to my son in law Samuel Beard  
200 Acres of Samuel Craigs survey  
with that 200 Acres he now lives on with  
Rufus 256 of Guinea then I Give to  
my Daughter Sarah Beard (to wit) to  
Samuel Beard and his Wife, all my  
Horses Mares Cows Sheep Hogs Hannah  
Catherine and Lilla with one Feather Bed

and Bed clothes and household goods  
with the 2 Stills and Still Vessels to their  
Proper use alone with the use of the  
Stillhouse and fire wood till the their  
comes of age which is to be Rented out  
the Plantation till that time or until  
such under an Overseer in his Care. He  
bequeath to himself Viz To Samuel Beard  
with the houses and stock now on it  
then I Give to my Daughter Mary  
Cowan <sup>fifty</sup> ~~thirty~~ Pennies with one Negro  
wench named Dina with all her  
Children, and likewise to John Cowan  
one half of that 1700 Acres he located  
on Pimans Creek if he chooses it and  
ten pounds for directing the survey the  
other to John Craig and Samuel Beard  
the whole between them. Then I Give

Deer and Bequeath to my youngest  
son John Craig all the rest of my Estate  
Personal and Real to have and to hold  
and to Adam Only 730 acres in sinking

Kelly ~~Walter~~ Buck Creek. I leave to William  
 Craig Son of James Craig to be Ten-  
 -ta out till he comes of age and the  
 Benefit to Pay for his schooling &  
 Clothing and be put to James Ely  
 to learn his trade. I then it is my will  
 that Judy and Frank and Silvey  
 be free after my Decease that she  
 live on the place with her mother Father  
 and Mother and her Child Mary and  
 to have the use or Milk of two Cows &  
 ten acres of Land joining their own  
 back in the woods between them while  
 they live, with the big cattle pots and  
 Cider. I then I do hereby nominate consti-  
 -tute and appoint my son John Craig  
 & Samuel Beana my solicitor to be  
 my Executors of this my Last will  
 and Testament and to collect all debts  
 due to me and pay all just Debts and  
 Legacies I then and last of all I do

and fifty Acres also a Mulatto Girl named Chime, with such furniture and stock as her mother thinks proper to spare: and to be considered as so much of her share of the Personal Estate. 9<sup>th</sup> I Give to my Eldest son William Craig an equal part with the rest of my Children of all my Estate that is not before now hereafter mentioned. 10<sup>th</sup> I Give to my Son John Craig an equal part with the rest of my Children of all my Estate that is not before now hereafter mentioned. 11<sup>th</sup> I Give to my Son <sup>David</sup> James Craig an equal share with the rest of my Children of all my Estate that is <sup>not</sup> before now hereafter mentioned. 12<sup>th</sup> I Give to my Son James Craig an equal share of my estate with with the rest of Children; that has not been before now hereafter mentioned. 13<sup>th</sup> I Give to my Son Charles Craig at the decease of his mother the Plantation whereon I now live as describ<sup>d</sup> above with an equal part with the rest of my Children of all my Estate that has not before now

heretofore mentioned: But on the promise that he relinquish his part of the Land left him by his Grand father Craig, and convey to his Brother David and James Equally between them. If not he only is to have his part with the rest of the Children of all my estate that has not been before nor hereafter mentioned and the three hundred Acres above mentioned is to be sold and divided between David and James Craig 3<sup>rd</sup>. I Give to my two youngest Children Mary Craig and Elisabeth Craig the Balance of my presumption Except Forty Acres to be joined to Philips' tract; Mary to have that part where Woodcut lives & Elisabeth next McCormacks to be divided between them: With an equal part with the rest of my Children of all my Estate that has not been before nor hereafter mentioned 9<sup>th</sup> It is my Will that the lands not divided be sold as soon after my decease as the nature of the case will admit and Equally divided among my Children when

come of Age. 10<sup>th</sup> And I do nominate Cap<sup>t</sup> Richard Gaines, Elisabeth Senior and William Craig my Son my Executors of this my last Will. as to sign my hand and Seal the 3<sup>rd</sup> Day of August Eighteen hundred and seven.
