In the name of God Amen
I John Craig of Lincoln County and
State of Kentucky being a Virgin and
not knowing how soon it may please
God to call me out of this world do
make constitute and ordain this my
last will and Testament in manner &
form following. That is to say inasmuch
I commona. My soul into the hands
of almighty God my Creator hoping

and Believing in his Mercy and inter-
cession of Jesus Christ my dear Teacher
and Merciful Savior through his merits
of salvation and free grace and Mercy
by his almighty power I shall have
a glorious resurrection at the last day
and made perfectly blessed in all
Enjoying of you to all Eternity.

And as to all my worldly substance
Wherewith it has pleased God to Befit
me I give devise and Bequeath in
Manner and form following (to wit)
it is my will that all my just debts
and funeral charges be paid.

Item I give devise and Bequeath to
William Craig son of John Craig my
Settlement wherein I now live containing
400 Acres & 100 Acres excess off course
line joining further field containing
the Branch from the Field to the
mouth. Item I give to his Brother John
Craig 400 Acres including the parts of

hereafter mentioned: But on this provis
that he relinquish his part of the
