

In the name of God amen I John Brown of Lincoln county and State of Kentucky being in a low State of Health though of perfect mind and memory calling to mind that all men are born once to die do make and ordain this my last will and Testament in manner and form as follows to wit that is to say first of all I recommend my soul into the hands of Almighty God who gave it and my body to the earth to be buried in a decent and Christian like manner and as touching my worldly Estate wherewith it has pleased God to bless me with I give and bequeath in manner and form as follows to wit, First all funeral charges and lawfull debts to be paid. Secondly I give and bequeath to my eldest daughter Elizabeth Lusk five shillings Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Martha Jamison five shillings and one featherbed and furniture. Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Mary Black five shillings

Item I give and bequeath to my son Lewis Brown or his heirs five shillings. Item I give and bequeath to my son Abraham Brown all my farming utensils of all sorts and all my iron tools of all sorts excepting one wedding also I give to my son Abraham my smooth bore gun Item I give and bequeath to my two daughters Sarah Brown and Ann Brown all my house hold furniture & kitchen furniture of all sorts and all my neat cattle and one wedding bar and all my out standing debts which may remain after the legacies and debts are paid & all my Estate whatsoever is to be the property of the said Sarah Brown and Ann Brown excepting what is already directed to the other legacies and Lastly I constitute and ordain my well beloved son Abraham Brown and my two Daughters Sarah Brown & Ann Brown the whole and sole Executors of this my last will and Testament. Utterly and lawfully disannulling and revoking all former wills and Testaments by me made and
