

A County Court held for Lincoln County the 15th day of December 1795. This Instrument of Writing was Exhibited in Court as the last Will & Testament of William Ramsey Deceased, and was proved to be his act and Sent by the Oaths of Edward Young and Thomas Montgomery Witnesses thereof, and ordered to be recorded. And on the petition of James old Town the Executor therein named, who made Oath, and with David Elrod & John old Town his Sureties entered into and acknowledged Bond in the penalty of Two hundred Pounds (conditioned as the law directs) a Certificate is granted him for obtaining a Probate thereof in due Form.

November the 30th 1795 agreeable to an Order of Court to us directed to appraise the Estate of John Vaughan Deceased after being first sworn according to Law have proceeded as followeth the wit

we met at Samuel Rowtons & being first sworn, proceeded
to appraise the Estate of David and Elizabeth Walker
Deceased which consisted in four Negroes viz. Jane
appraised to 80 £. Abby appraised to 80 £. James appra-
ised to 50 £. And Abraham appraised to 45 £. the
whole Amounts to 255 £. to be divided amongst the
claimants viz. Samuel Rowton, Jeph Walker, James
Sutton, Susanna Walker, Phoe Walker and Rhoda
Walker. they agreed to draw for their respective shares,
which Amounted to £42. 10 each, Samuel Rowton
draw Jane and is to pay £37. 10 each Jeph Walker
draw £42. 10 each James Sutton draw Abraham
and is to pay £2. 10. Susanna Walker draw Phoe
cash, Phoe Walker draw James and is to pay £7. 10
and Rhoda draw Abby and is to pay £37. 10. the
different overplus make up the allotments of Jeph and
Susanna Walker, which Samuel Rowton undertakes
to see paid. Witness our hands this 19th day of
January 1796.
