their heirs for ever.

I Will and give and devise all the other Lands in
and to which I have legal and just Claims Title or Interest
to my son Gabb Waller and his heirs forever. I also give to
my son Gabb Waller my Negro Tom or his heir forever. Also
I will that after my Decease that my son Gabb Waller have
and support my Negro Sambo.

I Will after all my just Debts and funeral expenses
are paid that all the residue of my Estate of what kind &
description soever may be equally divided to my son Gabb
Waller and my son in Law Henry Pauling and Elizabeth
Pauling his Wife to them & their heirs forever.
