 and make this my last Will and Testament. I
 give my body to the Earth from whence it was ta-
 ken with a certain hope of the resurrection at the
 Last day. And also such worldly Estate as I
 have pleased God to bestow on me with. I give and
 bequeath in the manner and form as followeth.
 I give and bequeath unto the children of my
 eldest Daughter Whittier Housler Polly & James
 Housler one Negro Boy by the name of Jason
 also all my other estate that should have fallen to
 my Daughter Whittier to be equally Divided
 between the said Polly and James after the Death
 of my Daughter Whittier to them and their heirs
 forever. I give unto my Daughter Frances
 Lewis two children Jean & Betsey Lewis one Negro
 Girl by the name of Anaxa as also all my other
 Estate that should have fallen to my Daughter
 Frances to be equally Divided between the said
 Jean and Betsey to them and their heirs forever.

I give unto my Daughter Elizabeth Brumson one
 Negro Girl by the name of Lucy to her and her heirs forever.
 I give unto my Daughter Polly Lee one Negro Girl
 Hannah to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my
 Daughter Jean Lewis one Negro Girl by the name of
 Rhody to her and her heirs forever. I give unto my
 Son Epitaph Jackson one Negro boy by the name
 of Stephen to him and his heirs forever. Also the Land
 and plantation whereon I now live contain-
 ing two hundred and fifty acres. Allowing my
 Daughter Whittier Housler the privilege of a
 peaceable possession on the plantation whereon she now
 lives during her natural life. Also my desire is
 that my Negro man Michael and my Negro
 Woman Loab shall be free & released from the State
 of Slavery at my death and they are at Liberty then.
 I will that all my Estate Sarah George, Bezekiah
 and whatsoever is yet unappropriated the value of
 it shall be equally Divided between my Children their
 names as follows Whittier two children Polly & James
 Frances two children Jean & Betsey Elizabeth Polly
 and Jean the Division to be agreeable to the above
 description. I am I do constitute this my last
 Will & Testament this and no other and do revoke

all other Will or Wills. Lastly I appointed my
 Son Ephraim & Zach^{ary} Shackelford Ex^{ors}. In Wit-
 ness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal
 this eighteenth day of May in the year of our
 Lord one thousand seven hundred & twenty seven.

The County Court held for Lincoln County the 10th
 day of October 1797. This Will was proved to be the
 last and duly of the said Joseph Jackson Deceased by
 the Oaths of David Logan and David Arnott Witnesses
 in thereto and ordered to be recorded. And on the ap-
 plication of Ephraim Jackson & Zachariah Shackelford
 the Executors therein named who made oath & acknow-
 ledge before said James Tinsley, David Arnott
 David Logan, Michael Lane & Levi Baldock Justices
 in the County of two thousand pounds a Certificate
 is granted them for obtaining a probat thereof in
 due form.

 my death I lend unto her during her Life two hundred
 Acres of Land on Ragg Beaver Creek bought of Lewis
 ingen together with the following Slave to wit old
 George Lewis James Bel Sarah Summervel Young
 Daniel & George with their Increase also two Servia-
 ble Horses one large Waggon & gear four shears one
 Feather Bed and furniture Also one forth part of all
 my cattle Sheep and hogs the same part of all my
 Household and Kitchen Furniture Carpenter Tools
 Plantation Tools Scales Locks Rings &c. And
 at her Decease it is my Will and desire that my son
 Joseph have the two hundred Acres of Land with
 the improvements and old George to him and his
 heirs or legal representatives the balance of said Stock
 and then American Dock Waggon and gear house-
 hold and Kitchen Furniture plantation Tools to
 be equally Divided among my six children to wit
 James William Joseph Daniel and Sally

Commissioners named in said Order and agree-
able to the same have proceeded to divide the
Lands shown to us by the said Legatee after
ascertaining the quantity of said Lands and
laying it off in Lots & numbering the same
have allotted to the said Legatee as follows to
wit To Jane Davis Widow and child of
Samuel Davis Dec'd the third part of the
cleared Lands on that Tract known by

bequeath to my daughter Lucy Giles a negro
girl called Cather now in my possession as the
whole of her right to my estate I leave give
him possession of said negro then I bequeath
I will that whole residue of my estate shall
remain in the hands possession of my wife Re-
becca during her life upon this condition
that as my children namely James Allen
Churchwell Allen Thomas Allen Rebecca
Allen Gabriel & Allen and Lucille Allen
because of lawfull age that she shall
each of them out of my estate with a
House worth twenty pounds fourth I will
that at my wife Rebecca what ever remains
of my shall be equally divided among the
whole of children except Lucy Giles who
I conceive has now got her equal proportion
in the negro girl Cather fifth I will that
if it should be the pleasure of my son
Churchwell Allen who I leave as my executor
to have any part of the property I have will

to the rest of my children except Lucy
Giles he is at liberty to do it by
accounting for them for the amount
writing my hand and seal this 26th day
of July 1804
