In Obediance to an order of the wor-
thippful Court of Lincoln County we have
proceeded to divide lay off and allot to the
Heirs of Josiah Huntsman Decd all the
Land or Estate of the said Josiah Hunts-
man, as follows (to wit) That tract of land
One hundred and fourteen Acres on the Hung-
ing fork and Flat lick Branch to be
divided by Main Beginning at a White
Walnut Horn ben and Logmore on a
line of John McCormack and the old
tract thence north sixty five degrees
East Eighty two poles passing through
the Apple Orchard to a Buckeye and
Hickberry standing near the Orchard
fence thence north thirty five degrees
East fifty two poles to a Hickory and
Buckeye saplings in a line of the old
Survey. The upper part of the said
tract being fifty two Acres, Including
the house and Spring we allot to Wil-
liam Huntsman, and the lower part In-
cluding the mill seat and bottom field

We Allot to Dolly Huntsman now
 Polly Dauterforda Containing Sixty two
 Acres: and the tract of land at
 McKinney's Station Containing one hun-
 dred and fifty five Acres. Beginning
 at two Sugar trees and hornbeam Daniel
 McKinney's Corner in a line of the
 Original Survey thence with S. D. Daul's
 line Eastwardly, forty seven poles to
 two Sugar trees and Ash in a line
 of S. D. Daul's thence South one hundred
 and sixteen poles grasping the field
 to a white walnut and Dog wood stand
 in a line of Hugh Logan and the
 Original tract thence West with the
 old line forty seven poles to a poplar
 Corner of the Original Survey thence North with
 the old line one hundred and sixteen
 poles to the Beginning: being the west
 End of the tract and Containing thirty
 four Acres we Allot to George Huntsman
 and to Benjamin Huntsman we allot

the following tract Beginning at a
 large poplar and horn beam on Hugh
 Logan's line thence North one hundred
 and twenty two poles to an Ash and horn
 beam on Arch. McKinney's line fifty poles
 to a white walnut stand near said
 McKinney's fence in his line thence
 South one hundred and sixteen poles to
 a Stake in Hugh Logan's field in a
 line of the old Survey thence West with
 the old line fifty poles to Beginning:
 The residue of the Original tract (being
 East of Benjamin Huntsman's lot)
 Containing thirty five Acres and including
 all the Clear land we Allot to Sally
 Huntsman, we also allot to the above
 named Sally, George and Benjamin
 Huntsman, an Equal fifty Acres out
 of the N. prob. Tract. In Testimony of
 which we have hereunto set our hands
 this third day of August 1835.

of Lincoln County and State of
Kentucky, Being in sound mind and
memory but feeling to mind the mor-
tality of my Body and that it is appoin-
ted for all men once to die do make
and ordain this my Last Will and
Testament: Item my will and desire
is that all my Just and lawful Debts

be first Paid and the Residue of
my Estate to be Divided as here after
shall be Directed.

Item: I Give to my well beloved Wife
Agnes the Plantation whereon I live
to her proper Use and Benefit during
her Natural Life and after her death
my Will and desire is that the Land
and Plantation be sold to John Bro-
nough and his heirs by Paying unto
Thomas Martin and James Hannah
Each my Debtors, Each the Sum of
one hundred Pounds, in four yearly
payments of fifty Pounds a Year without
Interest to be equally Divided between
them and if he doth not take the Land
by paying the before mentioned Sum
my Will and desire is that the Land
be Equally Divided between the afore-
said Thomas Martin and James Hannah: -

Item: I Give to my ^{wife} beloved Wife Agnes
one Negro woman named Winah her
Box and the boy that she may Chase

In Obeyance & in order of the
 Honorable Court of Lincoln County we have
 proceeded to divide lay off and allot
 to the heirs of Josiah Huntman Dec
 all the landed Estate of the said Josiah
 Huntman. It follows to wit That tract
 of one hundred and fourteen Acres on
 the Hanging fork and fork Dick branch
 to be divided by a line beginning
 at a white Walnut Stakeham and
 Sycamore on the N. E. corner of
 and the old tract thence north sixty
 five Degrees East Eighty two poles
 passing through

Now all men by the presence that I
 Lair of Lincoln and Commonwealth of Kentucky
 do constitute and appoint John Fair Junr
 of Bourbon County and Commonwealth of Ky my
 true and lawful attorney for me and in my
 Name to recover my legacy left me by my
 Father Matthias Fair and my Mother
 Catharine Fair or any part of Rich my
 as may be collected by the Executors Matthias
 and Catharine Fair Estate or any Settlement
 he will make with said Executors shall be
 as obligatory on me and have the Effect as
 if I was personally present and be lawfully
 authorized to make use of my Name in
 every Instance where it is necessary
 Should be in said Settlement given
 my hand and seal this 10th of December 1800
