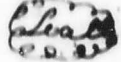

tention furniture to distribute equally among my three children at any time she may think proper so to do and I also bequeath unto my beloved wife Ann Moore six hundred dollars to be paid her by my Executors out of the profit arising out of the sale of my personal estate so soon as it can be had to dispose of as she may think proper further I give and devise unto my son Samuel Moore the remaining two thirds parts of the within tract of land together with the mansion house during the life the ~~mansion~~ house of his mother and my will and desire is that said tract of land be divided so as to leave two thirds of the cleared land in my said sons part which he shall have possession of at the age of twenty one years and after the death of his mother I doth devise the whole three hundred and fifty Acres unto my son Samuel Moore him her heirs and assigns forever I also give and devise unto my son Samuel Moore after the death of his mother my negro man named Ned and negro boy named Joseph unto him his heirs and assigns forever I also give and devise unto my Daughter Marguerete Moore the tract of land I now live on together

 possible possession of the same her and her and her
 heirs forever I also give and bequeath unto I do also
 give and bequeath my negro girl named Moore heirs
 and assigns forever I also give and desire all
 my lands lying in the State of Ohio unto my daughters
 Polly & Ann Moore and my will and desire is that
 said land be sold by my executors as its convenience
 and the money arising from the sale of said land
 be applied to the use of my said Daughter Polly
 Ann Moore at the time she may become married
 to her heirs and assigns forever And in case said
 land should not sell for as much as the land
 I have wished unto my daughter Margaret that
 then my will is that there be so much taken from
 my daughter Margaret Moore portion and given
 unto Polly Ann as to make the price of their lands
 both equal in And I also give and bequeath
 unto my daughter Polly Ann Moore my negro

girl named Edy to her her heirs and assigns forever
 I further further my will and desire is that the sum
 of money that are yet unpaid toward the pur-
 chasing of my brick house as before stated be
 discharged out of the profits of my personal estate
 before any distribution be made from the profits of the
 same And my will and my will and desire is that
 all the residue of my estate real and personal sold by
 my Executors and my will is that after the discharge
 of all my just debts the costs of building my house
 And the legacy wished to my Beloved Wife be paid that
 the residue be divided amongst my three children
 in the manner and form following I give and bequeath
 unto my son Samuel Moore three fifths of money
 that may be remaining from said stock in hand
 to be paid by my executors at the age of twenty
